**SUBJECT:** Agreement between the Riverside County Transportation Commission and the Transportation Department for State Route 111 at Lincoln Street/4<sup>th</sup> Street Intersection.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board approve the Agreement between the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) and the County of Riverside TLMA/Transportation Department (Transportation Department), and authorize the chairman to execute same.

**BACKGROUND:** The Transportation Department received approval for funding a proposed project to realign 66th Avenue to align with 4th Street where 4th Street intersects with SR 111 in the Mecca Area. The Transportation Department developed several alternatives for improving traffic capacity and safety at this location but ultimately determined the improvements would provide limited benefit and would be cost prohibitive. The project was subsequently cancelled.
