SUBJECT: Annual Local Detention Facility Inspection Reports 2008

The executive summary with individual reports has been forwarded to the California Department of Corrections for their review.

It should be noted that overall conditions have improved over the past several years.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY
OF DETENTION FACILITY INSPECTION
2008**

BACKGROUND AND ACTION

As mandated by California Health and Safety Code, Section 10145, local detention facilities must be inspected annually by a County Health Officer or local health department (Riverside County Community Health Agency, Department of Public Health). The Department of Public Health has determined that the most efficient method is to conduct "team inspections" of each facility. The inspection team includes a Registered Environmental Health Specialist, (REHS), a Public Health Nurse, and a Nutritionist. This annual re-inspection method is consistent with the established inter-departmental written protocol.

Each facility manager has been issued a copy of his / her respective report(s). This executive summary along with the abridged inspection report and individual reports has been forwarded to the California Department of Corrections as specified in California Health and Safety Code, Section 10145 for their review.

Environmental Evaluation Summary

Overall, except for a few minor structural problems, all major deficiencies noted last year have been corrected. As usual, new deficiencies have occurred due to usage and age of fixtures and some inmate induced problems; however, none of these new issues are serious. We recommend that each facility continues to keep up on maintenance problems as soon as they are presented.

It should be noted that next year the kitchen inspections will be using California Retail Food Code (which became effective July 1, 2007) instead of California Uniform Retail Food Facilities Law (CURFFL) which is no longer in use for inspections of commercial kitchens.

Nutrition Evaluation Summary

Adult Facilities

There were no areas of non-compliance noted for Adult Facilities. Staff shortages continue to be an issue at the Indio and Blythe sites. Policy and Procedure (P&P) manuals continue to be updated by Food Service Managers and reviewed by inspectors. We continue our recommendation that facilities continue to expand on their P&P's to make them site specific and address in more detail aspects of food service related to: 1) Safe food handling, 2) initial and on-going staff training in safe food handling, 3) emergency feeding plans, 4) communication and documentation of disciplinary and therapeutic diets prepared and served. Specific recommendations were made for each site by the inspector. In addition, we recommend sites expand their use of the Registered Dietitian (RD) to: a) review and approve changes to menus, b) develop a regular snack menu with appropriate revisions for various therapeutic diet orders, c) define how the RD will be involved to address any therapeutic diet orders that are not already in place with a menu for the kitchen to follow.

Juvenile Halls

All facilities now have a written food service plan that includes policies and procedures to address food service. It is recommended that each facility continue to further expand this written plan to be specific and up to date with the facility food service operations. Individual recommendations have been made for each site by the inspector. All Juvenile Halls have secured the services of an RD; however, at the time of inspection, menu review was complete but implementation of recommended changes was still in process. Therefore, facilities continue to be out of compliance with Title 15 requirements for items addressed in the Menu section, the Minimum Diet section, and the Therapeutic Diet section for this year. In addition, facilities will have to expand their use of the RD to include Title 15 requirements for the RD reviewing and approving menu changes, diet manual, etc., annually. It is expected that facilities will be in compliance for these areas by the next inspection.

Court Holding or Temporary Holding Facilities

There were no violations found in Court Holding or Temporary Holding facilities regarding nutrition. Although it is not a Title 15 requirement, we do recommend that Court Holding facilities create a written statement in their procedure manual designating responsibility for food service even though the facility itself may not prepare and serve the food. Last year, three facilities had acted upon this recommendation: Indio Larsen Justice Center, Riverside Hall of Justice, and Southwest Justice Center Court Holding. This year, three more facilities have acted upon it: Blythe Branch Court, Cathedral City Police Dept., and Riverside Family Law.

Medical/Mental Health Evaluation Summary

The county and city detention facilities have done very well in correcting most deficiencies noted last year, except for a few minor issues. The facilities continue to be current with their procedures and other regulation requirements. A suggestion was made at a few locations to draft policies regarding first aid in order to enhance communication and improve documentation. The City of Corona, Temporary Holding will be changing to a Type I Detention Facility and assistance from the Public Health Department has been offered regarding review of changes that will be needed in policy and procedures. The Detention Health Services Staff and staff from the city detention facilities that participated in the process with the health inspectors were helpful and cooperative.

ANNUAL FACILITY REPORT CARD

An annual facility "Report Card" which summarizes the violations and corrections noted during the 2008 inspections can be found at the end of the attached "Abridged Inspections Report 2008".

ABRIDGED INSPECTION REPORT 2008*

1.0 JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITIES

1.1. INDIO JUVENILE HALL

Environmental

During this inspection, three minor violations were noted.

Nutrition

Areas of Non-Compliance:

1461 Minimum Diet - Calories from fat are above 30% per two day average for week one, primarily due to whole milk cheese used in menu selections. Menu states all cheeses are low fat, however, cheeses available on day of inspection were regular fat content.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility. Recommend Probation draft a procedure for monitoring first aid kits to ensure items are replaced before they expire.

1.2 RIVERSIDE JUVENILE HALL

Environmental

During this inspection seven violations were noted:

1. The floors on all walk-in refrigerators are deteriorating and should be resealed in order to maintain a cleanable surface.
2. The aluminum coving in the walk-in refrigerator is separating from wall and should be repaired.
3. The remaining violations were minor plumbing and structural repairs that were noted in the report.

Nutrition

Areas of Non Compliance:

1461 Minimum Diet - Not meeting Title 15 requirement for third serving of protein three times per week from legumes. Recommend increasing portion sizes to 1 cup.

Vitamin A - Not meeting requirement of offering a food source high in Vitamin A daily, even when averaged over the week. There were two days in week five with no good source of Vitamin A and no extra sources on other days.

1462 Therapeutic Diets - Will need documentation that RD and Medical Director have approved a Diet Manual, even if it is the American Dietetic Associations (ADA) Nutrition Care Manual on line. Documentation needs to be updated annually.

Recommendations 1463 Menus - Currently does not keep a file for menu changes. Menu changes in this file will need to be reviewed and approved by RD on an annual basis.

Observations:

Improvements have been made this year in that the contract RD has reviewed and approved menu at the time of inspection. In addition, corrections have been made to Vitamin C and % Fat which are now meeting Title 15 Regulations.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

1.3 SOUTHWEST JUVENILE HALL

Environmental

During this inspection two minor structural maintenance problems were noted.

Nutrition

Areas of Non-Compliance:

1461 Minimum Diet - The total protein requirement was met for menu cycle week one; However, the legume requirement was deficient by one serving.

Dietary Fat exceeds 30 % total calories (average daily fat is 38% per analysis of week one, Tuesday and Thursday). A 5% increase over last year.

1462 Therapeutic Diets - Diet Manual in house was last signed by Dr. Laos, Medical Officer, on 5/23/06 and Nancy Banda, Consultant RD, on 5/22/06. Consultant RD is to ensure pending signatures are in diet manual prior to May 1, 2008, to ensure compliance with Title 15 Federal Guidelines.

Recommendations:

1463 Expand Food Service Plan

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility. The facility continues to meet all the Board of Corrections requirements.

1.4 TWIN PINES RANCH

Environmental

During this inspection the following violations were noted:

1. Remove dented and damaged cans from the dry storage area. (This was corrected during the inspection.)
2. The dishwasher was out-of-order at the time of inspection; however, staff is currently in the process of obtaining a new dishwasher. Paper plates and single-serve utensils are being utilized in the interim.
3. Replace damaged mattresses in bunkhouse

Nutrition

Areas of Non-Compliance:

1461 Minimum Diet - Not meeting requirement for limiting Dietary Fat to 30% of calories.

1463 Menus - RD should be reviewing and approving any changes to menu, including substitutions, to ensure change does not affect minimum daily requirements for identified nutrients.

Recommendations:

1464 Food Services Plan

Expand Food Service Plan.

Recommend for the second consecutive year the facility consider designating a food service supervisor who can provide consistent training to staff and oversee adherence to kitchen procedures to ensure safe and palatable food is being prepared and served at all times. This is important for the following reasons: to minimize unnecessary, excessive menu substitutions which compromise the menu, ordering, and jeopardize the overall integrity of the food service operation.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

1.5 VAN HORN YOUTH CENTER

Environmental

No deficiencies were observed at the time of the inspection.

Nutrition

Areas of Non-Compliance:

1461 Minimum Diet - Protein not meeting Title 15 requirement for third serving of protein three times per week from legumes. Recommend increasing portion sizes to 1 cup.

Vitamin A - Not meeting requirement of offering a food source high in Vitamin A daily, even when averaged over the week. There were two days in week five with no good source of Vitamin A and no extra sources on other days.

1462 Therapeutic Diets - Will need documentation that RD and Medical Director have approved a Diet Manual, even if it is the ADA Nutrition Care Manual on line. Documentation needs to be updated annually.

Observations:

Several corrections are noted this year.

1461 Minimum Diet - Corrections have been made to Vitamin C and % Fat which are now meeting Title 15 Regulations.

1462 Therapeutic Diets - Contract RD had reviewed and approved menu at the time of inspection.

1463 Menus - Contract RD had reviewed and approved menu at the time of inspection.

1464 Food Services Plan - The plan has been expanded again this past year and now addresses: 1) description of actual food service, including tray line temperature checks and logs, 2) how trash is disposed of, and 3) how kitchen equipment (refrigerators, stoves, freezers, etc.) is maintained, and the process for reporting need for repairs.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

2.0 ADULT DETENTION FACILITIES

2.1 BANNING COURT HOLDING

Environmental

Replace the torn mattress in Room #3

Nutrition

No deficiencies were noted.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility. This facility meets the minimum requirements as a court holding facility. Recommend developing a written procedure regarding periodic inspection of first aid kits and keep a log of completed inspections.

2.2 BLYTHE BRANCH COURT

Environmental

There are no deficiencies at this facility. This facility meets the minimum requirements as a court holding facility.

Nutrition

Observations:

1243 Food Manager - A policy entitled, "Routine & Emergency Food Service Procedure," which addresses food service and nutrition, has been created as part of the procedure manual. It is the responsibility of the Indio Jail to provide any meals and snacks to inmates.

Medical/Mental Health

There is one deficiency at this facility. Two others noted last year have been corrected. There was no policy/procedure to address the use of restraint devices as per last year.

2.3 BLYTHE JAIL

Environmental

No deficiencies were observed.

Nutrition

Observations:

1243 Food Service Plan - This year several changes have been made to improve on food service system:

Recommendations:

1242 Menus - Recommend keeping production sheet file on site for inspector review and be sure to have documentation of RD approval regarding any menu changes.

1243 Food Service Plan - Recommend expanding "Procedure for Transporting Meals" and "Medical Therapeutic Diets" to include use of the new "Special Meal Form" where appropriate and how food is transported to and from Court Holding Facility.

Medical/Mental Health

No deficiencies at this facility. Minimum requirements are met.

2.4 CATHEDRAL CITY JAIL

Environmental

No deficiencies noted

Nutrition

Observation:

1243 Food Service Plan - Facility has implemented recommendation of adding a signature page to the P&P manual for revisions and additions. Annual review is still recommended regardless of revisions/additions.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility. Fire department monitoring of the first aid kits is now documented in the procedure manual.

2.5 CORONA CITY JAIL

Environmental

During this inspection two minor structural maintenance problems were noted.

Nutrition

Recommendations:

1243 Food Manager - Need to create a brief food service plan describing actual food service and how meals for inmates on therapeutic diets are handled.

Medical/Mental Health

No deficiencies were observed. A new Type I Detention Facility is being planned, with completion expected March 2009.

Recommendations:

1. Review Title 15 regulations for Type I Detention Facility.
2. Write new policies/procedures for a Type I Detention Facility.
3. Provide new policies and procedures to inspection team for review and assistance.

2.6 CORONA COURT HOLDING

Environmental

There are no deficiencies at this facility. This facility meets the minimum requirements as a court holding facility.

Nutrition

No deficiencies were noted.

Medical/Mental Health

No deficiencies observed, and this facility meets requirements. No paperwork / forms are used to document monthly first aid kit checks by deputies. Recommendation: Create a log for first aid kit checks, as per last year's recommendation.

2.7 DESERT HOT SPRINGS CITY JAIL

Environmental

Recommendations:

Provide hard foam on floor and walls for sobering cell (Cell #1).

Nutrition

No violations were observed.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

2.8 HEMET CITY JAIL

Environmental

During this inspection four minor maintenance problems were noted.

Nutrition

Recommendations:

1241 Minimum Diet - Add fresh fruit to meals such as an apple or orange to ensure Title 15 requirement for one serving of fresh produce per day is met. Use Vitamin C Fortified Juices to meet Vitamin C requirement. Keep fresh milk or powdered milk (such as Carnation Instant Milk) on hand to meet Title 15 requirement for Calcium.

1243 Food Service Plan - Expand existing procedure for "Food" to include the following:

- a) The need to manage food inventory by rotating foods using the first in/first out system to minimize risk of food spoilage.
- b) A notation in Food Service Plan that inmates will be given at least 15 minutes to eat before trays are picked up.

Medical/Mental Health

There are two deficiencies at this facility:

- 1) Staff currently key in code on keypad in the front portion of the cell. No documentation of comments such as sleeping, snoring, etc. When checking person in sobering cell, recommend adding assessment form to document status of inmate.
- 2) Restraint procedure does mention prostraint chair, however, it does not cover signs and symptoms that should result in immediate medical/mental health referral, availability of CPR equipment, protective housing, hydration, sanitation need, or exercising of extremities.

2.9 HEMET BRANCH COURT

(This facility is not currently being used)

Environmental

This facility meets minimum requirements for a court holding facility.

Nutrition

No violations noted.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this time.

2.10 INDIO JAIL

Environmental

During this inspection, seven minor maintenance violations were noted.

Nutrition

No deficiencies were observed at this facility.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

2.11 INDIO LARSEN JUSTICE CENTER

Environmental

There are no deficiencies at this facility

Nutrition

Observations:

1243 Food Service Plan - This year several changes have been made to improve on food service system.

Recommendations:

1242 Menus - Recommend keeping production sheet file on site for inspector review and be sure to have documentation of RD approval regarding any menu changes.

1243 Food Service Plan -

1) Recommend posting memo in kitchen that describes actual meal service while short staffed to include food preparation at Banning, transportation to Indio, and service at Indio.

2) Recommend expanding "Procedure for Transporting Meals" and "Medical Therapeutic Diets" to include use of the new "Special Meal Form" where appropriate and how food is transported to and from Court Holding Facility.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

2.12 LARRY D. SMITH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

Environmental

During this inspection fourteen violations were noted:

1. Clean dirt and debris on fan grill in produce freezer.
2. ALL Housing Units: After using hair clippers, clean all blades and clipper guards of remaining hair.
3. The remaining violations were minor corrections, such as plumbing and structural repairs that were noted in the report.

Nutrition

No deficiencies.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility. Recommend that policies which overlap between Department of Health Services (DHS) and Mental Health be discussed by both disciplines. Mental Health should have copies of DHS policies/procedures to clarify roles of caring for inmates.

2.13 PALM SPRINGS CITY JAIL

Environmental

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

Nutrition

Recommendations:

1243 Food Service Plan - P&P manual should be reviewed annually and documented on signature page with date in back of P & P Manual regardless of whether any revisions or additions have been made.

Medical/Mental Health:

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

Recommendations:

1. Keep records of first aid kit inspections completed by Cintas Company in a three ring binder.
2. Install locks on cabinets and refrigeration units for medication storage.

**2.14 RIVERSIDE SUPERIOR COURTS
FAMILY LAW COURT HOLDING FACILITY**

Environmental

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

Nutrition

Observations:

Memorandum dated January 7, 2008, from Lt. Art Gonzales was located in the P & P manual stating, "No meals are prepared or served to inmates. Inmates receive their sack lunches, other meals or special food concerns are provided by the Robert Presley Detention Center".

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

2.15 RIVERSIDE HALL OF JUSTICE

Environmental

During this inspection, five minor violations were noted.

Nutrition

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

Medical/Mental Health

There are no deficiencies at this facility. Minimum requirements for Title 15 are met.

2.16 ROBERT PRESLEY DETENTION CENTER

Environmental

During this inspection, twenty-four minor plumbing and structural repairs (ranging from leaking pipes and valves to ripped mattress) were noted in the report.

Nutrition

Recommendations:

1247 Disciplinary Diets / 1248 Medical Diets - Recommend expansion of sections 509.04 in P&P to reflect recent changes and use of the "Special Meal Form".

Medical/Mental Health:

There is one deficiency at this facility regarding progress notes.

Recommendations:

1. Charting needs to be coherent with the care provided (i.e. SOAP notes).
2. A follow-up plan is needed when patient refuses care.
3. Peer review (monthly) and charts audit (quarterly).

2.17 SOUTHWEST COUNTY DETENTION CENTER

Environmental

During this inspection twelve violations were noted.

Recommendations:

1. Pick up food from floor during preparation and all other times.
2. No personal drinks or food are to be stored in kitchen refrigerators.
3. Store all pots and pans with bottom side up.
4. The majority of the remaining violations were minor plumbing and structural repairs that were noted in the report.

Nutrition

Recommendations:

1247 Disciplinary Diets / 1248 Medical Diets - Recommend expansion of sections in policy and procedure manual related to Disciplinary and Medical diets to reflect recent changes and use of the "Special Meal Form".

Medical/Mental Health

There were no deficiencies at this facility.

Medical records upkeep greatly improved, issue resolved. Staff trained in use of automatic external defibrillators (AED's) which have been ordered.

2.18 SOUTHWEST COUNTY MUNICIPAL COURT HOLDING

Environmental

There are no deficiencies at this facility. This facility meets the minimum requirements as a court holding facility.

Nutrition

There are no deficiencies at this facility.

Medical/Mental Health

There were no deficiencies at this facility.
