5 WHEREAS, the United States House of Representatives Committee on Appropriations,
6 Sub-Committee on Energy and Water Development, and the United States Senate Committee on
7 Appropriations, Sub-Committee on Energy and Water Development are holding hearings to
8 consider appropriations for Flood Control and Reclamation Projects for Fiscal Year 2010 and
9 have requested written testimony to be submitted to the committees during February and March
10 2009; and

12 WHEREAS, the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District
13 supports the continuation of construction efforts on the critical flood control project known as
14 Murrieta Creek Flood Control, Environmental Restoration and Recreation Project; the
15 establishment of Special Legislation addressing the design and construction of the Heacock and
16 Cactus Channels providing flood protection to March Air Reserve Base; the furtherance of
17 construction activities on the Santa Ana River Mainstem Project, including Prado Dam and the
18 Lower Santa Ana River; the continuation of Corps efforts in completing the Special Area
19 Management Plan for the San Jacinto and Santa Margarita River Watersheds; and the
20 establishment of a National Policy addressing the certification of Corps constructed levees.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the Riverside
23 County Flood Control and Water Conservation District in regular session assembled on February
24 24, 2009 that they support appropriations by Congress for Fiscal Year 2010 for the following
