SUBJECT: Agreement between the Riverside County Regional Parks and Open Space District and the Riverside County Transportation Department for multi-purpose trail improvements on Bain Street.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board approve the Agreement between the Regional Parks and Open Space District (Parks District) and the Riverside County Transportation Department (RCTD) , and authorize your chairman to execute same.

BACKGROUND: The Parks District has "Development Impact Fees" funding to provide a regional trail running between Bain Street and the San Sevaine Flood Control Channel. The limits of proposed trail is from Limonite Avenue up to Galena Street (a distance of approximately 2 miles) and will connect to an existing trail near Galena Street.

The RCTD will perform the design and construction services for the project and the Parks District will reimburse the RCTD for the services provided.

A minor portion of the trail crosses three parcels of vacant land owned by the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (Flood Control). Parks District, Transportation Department and Flood Control intend to enter into a separate License Agreement pertaining to the use of these parcels.
