SUBJECT: Adoption of Resolution NO. 2009-113 Authorizing the Application for a Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant Application for Eligible Properties within Unincorporated Riverside County

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2009-113 authorizing the application for a Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant for eligible properties within unincorporated Riverside County.

BACKGROUND:

The people of the State of California have enacted Senate Bill 1330 (Lockyer, Statutes of 1997 Chapter 2.5), which authorizes the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) to award Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grants to eligible applicants to pay for the costs of cleanup, abatement, or other remedial action related to the disposal of illegal solid waste on farm or ranch property.

No matching funds are required for this reimbursement grant. Applications for this grant are site specific and can be submitted four times a year. Grants are limited to \$50,000 per cleanup or abatement project, with a limit of \$200,000 per fiscal year. Utilization of this grant will allow the Code Enforcement Department to abate solid waste on properties where recovery of abatement costs may not be practical due to high cost or other factors. This grant should allow the Code Enforcement Department to conduct more solid waste abatements annually with the limited resources available.

8 WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have
9 enacted Senate Bill 1330 (Lockyer, Statutes of 1997, Chapter
10 2.5), which authorizes the California Integrated Waste
11 Management Board (CIWMB) to award Farm and Ranch Solid Waste
12 Cleanup and Abatement Grants (Grant) to eligible applicants to
13 pay for reimbursement of designated costs of cleanup,
14 abatement, or other remedial action related to the disposal of
15 illegal solid waste on farm or ranch property; and

16 WHEREAS, the receipt of CIWMB Farm and Ranch Solid Waste
17 Cleanup and Abatement Grants would increase the ability of
18 staff to either remove or abate public nuisances arising from
19 trash, rubbish and debris throughout the unincorporated areas
20 of the County of Riverside; and

21 WHEREAS, the County of Riverside Code Enforcement
22 Department has sufficient resources, technical expertise and/or
23 experience with similar projects to carry out the proposed
24 cleanup programs to fully remediate cleanup projects identified
25 in the Grant Agreements; and

1 WHEREAS, the CIWMB requires as a condition of application
2 that the applicant authorizes by resolution certain matters
3 prior to the submission of the Grant application;

5 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND**
6 **ORDERED** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside,
7 State of California, in regular session on March 17, 2009, as
8 follows:

- 9 1. That the Board of Supervisors hereby finds and declares
10 that the above recitals are true and correct.
- 11 2. That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the filing of
12 applications for the Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup
13 and Abatement Grants for the period of 2009 through
14 2014.
- 15 3. That the Board of Supervisors has determined that
16 delegating authority to the Director of Code Enforcement
17 to execute necessary Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup
18 and Abatement Grant documents would facilitate the
19 implementation of the cleanup programs, increase
20 efficiency, and save administrative costs.
- 21 4. That the Board of Supervisors hereby delegates to the
22 Director of Code Enforcement, or his designee, the
23 authority and power to execute in the name of the County
24 of Riverside all necessary Farm and Ranch Solid Waste
25 Cleanup and Abatement Grant documents, including, but

1 not limited to, the application, the Grant Agreement,
2 the Grant Payment Requests, and amendments necessary for
3 the purposes of securing grant funds and for the
4 implementation and completion of the Grant projects.
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
