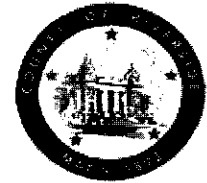

The Riverside County Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office have joined forces with police agencies throughout Riverside County to combat the increase in gang activities occurring throughout the county. This strategy has resulted in the formation of the Riverside County Gang Task Force. The task force is comprised of eight regional task force teams made up of members from various Federal, State, County and local agencies.

Using the model of prevention, intervention and suppression, gang task force members use all available resources and strategies to help eliminate gang violence. In an effort to maximize the effect of the multiplying multi-agency task force, the task force recently implemented a new strategy called "Saturation Days." Once a month, 85 peace officers, from the 8 regions, join forces in a chosen city or community within the county, and saturate the area with law enforcement.

On December 6, 2005 (agenda item 3.25), the Riverside County Board of Supervisors approved the establishment of the task force and funding to staff and equip the task force. Other participating agencies have provided staffing, equipment and work sites to house these teams. On September 18, 2007 (agenda item 3.51), the Board acknowledged acceptance of the FY 2006/07 Anti-Gang Initiative Grant and authorized the purchase of 21 800 MHz handie-talkie radios for the Task Force. On March 18, 2008 (agenda item 3.31), the Board acknowledged acceptance of the FY 2007/08 Anti-Gang Initiative Grant and authorized the installation and maintenance of 4 county network lines at 4 non-county partner facilities by the Riverside County Information Technology Department to provide full access to law enforcement databases.

The California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA), formerly the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES), has again been awarded Anti-Gang Initiative federal funding to implement this program on behalf of the United States Attorneys in the Central District of California.

Grant funds must supplement, not supplant local funds; therefore, the grant cannot be used for existing positions. As this funding is not guaranteed in future years, it was not feasible to add positions.

Supervising District Attorney Investigator Joe DelGiudice developed this year's "Saturation Day" concept for the County-wide Gang Task Force, in which every police agency in the County participates. He presented the concept to the U.S. Attorney's Office, and the concept was accepted for award. As the County-wide Gang Task Force is directed by a Sheriff's Department Captain, and the Sheriff's Department has a specialized grant unit, the Sheriff's Department is Riverside County's Implementing Agency for the grant.

CalEMA funding will enable the Task Force to purchase a trailer to serve as a mobile command post made available to all participating state and local agencies. Grant funds will support the project from October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009.

County Counsel has reviewed the award documents and approved them as to form.
