The COPS Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP) is funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Recovery Act) of 2009, P.L.111-5 and awards grants directly to law enforcement agencies to hire and/or rehire sworn law enforcement officers in an effort to create and preserve jobs and to increase community policing capacity and crime-prevention efforts. The grantor requires original signatures of the Sheriff and the Chair of the Board of Supervisors on the forms at the time of grant application. The grant funds entry-level salaries and benefits for sworn personnel for a period of 36 months. There is no match requirement.

The Recovery Act Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Formula Program (Local Solicitation) is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. JAG funds support all components of the criminal justice system, from multijurisdictional drug and gang task forces to crime prevention and domestic violence programs, courts, corrections, treatment, and justice information sharing initiatives. The grantor requires original signatures of the Chair of the Board of Supervisors on the assurances forms at the time of grant application. There is no match requirement.

The Recovery Act Edward Byrne Memorial Competitive Grant Program (Byrne Competitive Program) will help communities improve the capacity of state and local justice systems and provide for national support efforts including training and technical assistance programs strategically targeted to address local needs. The grantor requires original signatures of the Chair of the Board of Supervisors on the assurances forms at the time of grant application. There is no match requirement.

The Recovery Act State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Program: Combating *Criminal Narcotics Activity Stemming from the Southern Border of the United States* Competitive Grant is designed to provide resources for hiring and retention of, and assistance and equipment to local law enforcement along the Southern border and in High-Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas in order to combat criminal narcotics activity stemming from the Southern border of the United States. The grantor requires original signatures of the Chair of the Board of Supervisors on the assurances forms at the time of grant application. There is no match requirement.

Grants awarded will be brought to the Board for acceptance.
