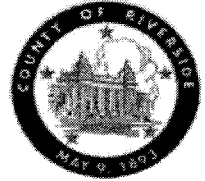

**SUBJECT:** 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest.



**SUBJECT: 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest.**

**BACKGROUND (CONT'D):**

The purpose of this contest is to give students an opportunity to artistically depict the ways in which they can enjoy life without drugs. The contest aids in providing students with peers who serve as positive role models by setting good examples and encouraging others to look at drug-free alternatives.

On Friday, February 15, 2008, students throughout Riverside County attending public, private and parochial schools, representing Grades Kindergarten -12 were invited to enter the contest in one of the following categories: Grades Kindergarten – 2, Grades 3 - 5, Grades 6 - 8, and Grades 9-12. All entries were judged on originality, neatness, most persuasive use of theme, and how well the entry conveyed the message to others. All contest participants received a certificate of participation. First place winners in each category receive an engraved plaque. The event was co-sponsored by the Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse Program and the Riverside County Office of Education.

The Department of Mental Health, Substance Abuse Program requests the Board of Supervisors to formally recognize and present the awards to the four (4) First Place winners in each category. The 2009 Poster Contest Winners are listed below.
