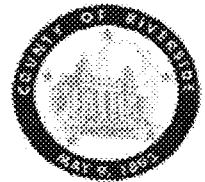

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that:

- (1) The grading without permits on the real property located at 1 Parcel South of 40060 Beaver Avenue, Aguanga, Riverside County, California, APN: 571-230-037, be declared a public nuisance and a violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457 which does not permit grading of more than fifty (50) cubic yards without a grading permit.
- (2) That a five (5) year hold on the issuance of building permits and land use approvals be placed on The Property.

- (3) Larry L. Dyson and Vickie Dyson, the Owners of the subject real property or whoever has possession or control of the premises, be directed to restore or remediate the unpermitted grading within ninety (90) days.
- (4) If the owners or whoever has possession or control of the real property do not take the above described action within ninety (90) days of the date of the mailing and posting of the Board's Order to Abate, that representatives of the Code Enforcement Department are authorized to obtain the services of a contractor, upon consent of the owner or receipt of a Court Order authorizing entry onto the real property when necessary under applicable law, to restore or remediate the property so as to prevent offsite drainage and slope erosion.
- (5) The reasonable costs of abatement, after notice and an opportunity for hearing, shall be imposed as a lien on the real property, which may be collected as a special assessment against the real property pursuant to Government Code Section 25845 and Ordinance No. 725.
- (6) That upon the restoration or remediation of the property and payment of all abatement costs assessed against the property, the five (5) year hold on the issuance of building permits and land use approvals will be lifted.
- (7) County Counsel be directed to prepare the necessary Findings of Facts and Conclusions that the grading without a permit on the real property is declared to be in violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457 and a public nuisance, and further, to prepare an Order to Abate for approval by the Board.

JUSTIFICATION:

1. An inspection was made of the subject property by the Code Enforcement Officer on October 31, 2007. The inspection revealed grading on the property and cuts that were approximately thirty (30) feet in depth and fills up to forty (40) feet in some areas along with significant erosion in violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457 (RCC Title 15). The Officer measured that approximately one hundred sixty thousand (160,000) cubic yards of dirt has been graded. A search of Riverside County records indicates that no permit for grading has been obtained. This creates a public and attractive nuisance.
2. Follow-up inspections on March 29, 2008, April 22, 2008, July 18, 2008, September 9, 2008, February 3, 2009, March 27, 2009 and June 22, 2009, revealed that the property continues to be in violation of Riverside County Ordinance No. 457.
3. Staff and the Code Enforcement Department have complied with the notice requirements set forth in the appropriate laws of this jurisdiction pertaining to the administrative abatement proceedings for grading without a permit.
