From January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008, 719 adoptions were finalized and children have been connected to permanent families through Riverside County Department of Public Social Services, Children's Services Division.

BACKGROUND CONTINUED:

One of the Federal and State Performance Improvement Plan measures requires counties to increase the number of adoptions completed within 24 months of removal from the home. Of all the children adopted in Riverside County, 32% were adopted within 24 months, which is above the state average of 30.5%.

Despite our efforts to ensure children do not linger in foster care and that they receive families whom they may call their own, as quickly as possible, there are still children who remain in foster care awaiting permanent adoptive homes.

Currently in Riverside County alone there are 486 children awaiting a permanent adoptive home.

This proclamation serves to commend Riverside County adoptive parents for their significant contributions to strengthening and improving our families and communities. It also provides awareness about those children still awaiting permanent adoptive homes and the need for continued efforts to decrease the number of children waiting to be adopted.
