SUBJECT: Approval of the Conflict of Interest Code for the Jurupa Community Services District

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approve the amended Conflict of Interest Code submitted by the Jurupa Community Services District.

BACKGROUND: Government Code section 87306.5 requires that all local agencies review their Conflict of Interest Code, and the listing of designated positions for employees who must disclose along with the types of disclosure required, and make appropriate amendments to each as required.

The Jurupa Community Services District recently revised Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" of the Appendix to its Conflict of Interest Code and has submitted it for approval by the Board of Supervisors as the code reviewing body.

This office has reviewed the revised code and has found that it complies with statutory requirements. It is recommended that the Jurupa Community Services District's revised code be approved and that the Clerk of the Board notify the Agency of the action taken.



<u>Category 6</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Employee's Department.

RESOLUTION NO. 2070

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE JURUPA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AMENDING THE APPENDIX OF THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code Section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Jurupa Community Services District (the "District") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors adopted a Conflict of Interest Code (the "Code") which was amended on November 24, 2008, in compliance with the Act; and

whereas, subsequent changed circumstances within the made it advisable and necessary pursuant to Sections 87306 and 87307 of the Act to amend and update the Appendix of the District's Code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in the District being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Board of Directors of, the proposed amended Appendix was provided each affected designated employee and publicly posted for review at the offices of the District; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Appendix at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors on November 23, 2009, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Appendix.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Jurupa Community Services District that the Board of Directors does hereby adopt the proposed amended Appendix of the Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the General Manager and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Appendix shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside for approval and said

Appendix shall become effective 30 days after the Board of Supervisors approves the proposed amended Appendix as submitted.
