

In accordance with Ordinance 784, a Commissioner or Alternate may serve two terms. After the initial term, all reappointments are for three years.

BACKGROUND/APPOINTEE INFORMATION:

On June 9, 2009 the Board of Supervisors amended the membership section (Section 5, subsection B.) of Ordinance 784 to reflect the appointment of six Commissioners and six Alternate Commissioners. Each member of the Board of Supervisors is to appoint one Commissioner and one alternate with the sixth being an At-Large appointment by the entire Board. These appointments are in addition to those of a member of the Board of Supervisors, the County Health Officer, and an individual responsible for the management of one of several enumerated County functions. The Alternate Commissioners will also serve as Advisory Committee members, in compliance with Proposition 10 statutes.

The Ordinance specifies the qualifications for appointment, which includes a representative of a Local Organization for Prevention or Early Intervention for Families at Risk in Riverside County. Ms. Judith Cox is the Executive Director of the Regional Access Project Foundation, a non-profit organization committed to supporting health, mental health, and juvenile prevention and intervention programs in the Coachella Valley. Ms. Cox has served on the First 5 Riverside Advisory Committee since January 2009 and also serves as a member of the local Emergency Food and Shelter Board. Ms. Cox's experience and leadership will make her a tremendous asset to the Riverside County Children and Families Commission.
