BACKGROUND:

The Coachella Valley Association of Governments (CVAG) Homelessness Committee will be purchasing bus passes from the Sunline Transit Agency for the benefit of local homelessness service providers. The CVAG Homelessness Committee believes that it is necessary for each city and the county to provide financial contribution to create a program that will support the worthwhile work of non-profit service providers. Clients will be able to utilize the Sun Bus to access supportive services, seek employment, and other essential services.

Desert Women for Equality serves underinsured or uninsured women of the Coachella Valley by giving them free mammograms. Four free clinics will take place in Indio, Coachella and Thermal. Desert Women for Equality is able to provide free mammograms by partnering with the Desert Healthcare District, Regional Access Project Foundation, Borrego Community Foundation, local cities, community groups and businesses.
