Elder abuse and neglect is a serious and growing problem across the nation, with the majority of victims being elders 75 years of age or older. Between 1 and 2 million Americans, age 65 or older have been injured, exploited or mistreated by someone on whom they depended for care or protection. In fact, two-thirds of abusers are family members. Yet it is estimated that as few as one in five elder abuse cases are actually reported to authorities.

## BACKGROUND: (cont'd)

The United States Census Bureau projects that California's elderly population will nearly double within the next 30 years—from 6.4 million to more than 12 million individuals, largely due to the aging of the Baby Boomers (persons born between 1946 and 1964). As Baby Boomers reach retirement age, California is projected (by 2025) to rank first in the nation in having the largest number of elderly residents. In Riverside County, almost 1 in 5 residents are 60 years of age or older. With a strong commitment to partnership in our community, Riverside County can continue to lead the effort to prevent, investigate, treat and prosecute cases of elder abuse in our County. In support of these efforts and to increase community awareness of these issues, we join in asking the Riverside County Board of Supervisors to proclaim May 2010 as Elder Abuse Awareness Month.

## ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in 2009 more than 5,000 reports of abuse against the elderly were received by Riverside County Adult Protective Services;

WHEREAS, it is estimated that as few as one in five elder abuse cases are actually reported;

WHEREAS, our elderly population has greatly influenced and shaped today's world, yet are often vulnerable to abuse and neglect and may be unable to prevent, seek protection from or report criminal elder abuse;

WHEREAS, today there is a system of collaboration among the Department of Public Social Services-Adult Protective Services, the Riverside County Sheriff's Department and local police departments, the District Attorney, the Riverside County Regional Medical Center, the Office on Aging-Long Term Care Ombudsman, the Department of Mental Health-Offices of the Public Guardian-Conservator, and many community services partners to prevent abuse, protect victims, and prosecute offenders who abuse our elderly;

WHEREAS, Riverside County is a leader in the State of California in assisting our vulnerable elderly citizens through education, advocacy and collaboration on abuse issues;

WHEREAS, we, as one community, come together each year to rededicate ourselves to providing a safety net to keep our elderly citizens safe from abuse, neglect and exploitation.

NOW, THEREFORE, let it be known that the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County does hereby proclaim the month of May 2010 to be **ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH**, and encourages all citizens of Riverside County to join them in this observance.
