SUBJECT: Approve Sole Source Service Agreement with the State of California, California Emergency Management Agency (CALEMA), California Specialized Training Institute (CSTI).

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Approve sole source service agreement for one year with CALEMA, CSTI for a total of \$77,000 the first year, without seeking competitive bids, which contains the option to renew the agreement for three additional one-year periods; and
- 2. Authorize Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, to exercise the renewal option, based on the availability of fiscal funding, and to sign amendments to the compensation provision that do not exceed the annual CPI rates; and
- 3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to return four original signed agreements to the Purchasing and Fleet Services Department.

BACKGROUND: Riverside County Fire Department Office of Emergency Services (FIRE OES) has secured grant funds from the State Homeland Security Grant Program and Emergency Management Performance Grant to obtain State of California approved Disaster Preparedness training for the County.

These classes will enhance the knowledge of OES staff members as well as members of the Operational Area to enable us to coordinate and successfully host disaster exercises, coordinate disaster mitigation and disaster recovery efforts on behalf of the County. The costs are in the FY 09/10 budget and in the proposed FY 10/11 budget. Fire is not requesting a budget adjustment.

PRICE REASONABLENESS:

Training classes for Disaster Preparedness and Mitigation are very specific in nature and CALEMA, CSTI is the only vendor approved by the State of California to provide such specialized training and is tailored directly to the hazards facing California.

If Fire OES were to send eleven students to CALEMA, CSTI in San Luis Obispo total cost would be approximately \$22,000. Bringing the CSTI courses to the County of Riverside would allow the opportunity to train thirty-five to forty individuals per class without incurring the costs for hotel accommodations, per diem charges, and travel expense claims normally associated when sending employees to the vendor's location for training.

Alternative suppliers that can or might be able to provide supply/service:

CSTI is the only provider who can deliver highly specialized training designed specifically to address hazards facing California; CSTI also delivers the training incorporating the Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS) structure, which is specific to California-based responses. ICS is a critical component of California-based emergency response for fire, law, health, EMS and emergency management.

Extent of market search conducted:

As a branch of the Governor's California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI was developed specifically for the purpose of offering California-based emergency management training. FIRE OES have worked with many other industry professional training institutions across the United States for many years and none are able to offer this specialized training. Specifically, Texas Engineering Extension Service (TEEX), Wildan Homeland Solutions and independent consultant/trainers are among a few who we have contacted regarding these specialized trainings and none are as specific as CSTI.

Unique features of the supply/service being requested from this supplier, which no alternative supplier can provide:

CSTI has been designed to teach California's emergency management personnel how to mitigate, prepare and respond to disasters; other institutions are unable to offer this California-based specialized training.

Reasons why my department requires these unique features and what benefit will accrue to the county:

Riverside County emergency management and first responders have a long history of being in the forefront of mitigation and response because of specialized training; and would like to continue that tradition. The benefit to the County of Riverside will be enhanced knowledge of emergency management and first responder personnel during a catastrophic event which will help save lives and property and restore life back to normal as soon as possible after a major incident. The training will be hosted in Riverside County mitigating travel costs for personnel who, due to budget shortages, may have not otherwise had the opportunity to partake in this much needed training.

Price Reasonableness:

The training classes: Managing Sustained Operations, Access & Functional Needs, Basic Public Information Officer, and Enhanced Exercise Design Conduct and Evaluation are very specific in nature and CALEMA, CSTI is the only vendor approved by the State of California to provide such specialized training and is tailored directly to the hazards facing California.

- 3. This Agreement may be terminated upon 30 days written notice. Contracting Organization agrees to pay California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI for all satisfactory work performed through termination date.
- 4. No alteration or variation of the terms of this contract shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto, and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein, shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.
- 5. If Contracting Organization is a county, city, district or other local public body, this Agreement is not valid unless accompanied by a copy of the resolution, order, motion, or ordinance of the local governing body by law having authority to enter into the proposed contract approving and authorizing execution of this Agreement.

(ATTACHMENT A) GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The State's Representative for this Agreement shall be Robert Lewis, Chief of Emergency Management Section, California Specialized Training Institute, or his designee.
- 2. Client agrees to pay the California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI in arrears upon receipt of an invoice(s) from:

- 3. For work to be performed as outlined within this Agreement, the total amount payable to California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI shall not exceed \$77,000.00. The term of this agreement is June 1, 2010 start through March 31, 2011 ending date.
- 4. This agreement is of no effect unless, and until, approved by the California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI, and other agencies, as appropriate.
- 5. Unless otherwise designated, all materials produced in connection with this Agreement are the property of CSTI and the California Emergency Management Agency, at all stages of development and production to the completion of the final products. This comprises reports and other printed or audio/visual materials. This also includes, but is not limited to, any associated materials, which are clearly the issue of this Agreement. Client shall hold the State of California free of potential difficulties arising from the unauthorized use of previously copyrighted materials of any kind.
- 6. This Agreement may be amended in writing as may be mutually agreed to by the parties hereto.
- 7. California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice.
- 8. California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI and Client agree that, the existence of a dispute notwithstanding, they will continue without delay to carry out all their responsibilities under this Contract which are not affected by the dispute.
- 9. California Emergency Management Agency, CSTI shall review by inspection and/or audit, to the extent necessary, to determine that payments were made in accordance with the Agreement. All Clients' records shall be made available and retained for three (3) years after termination of this Agreement, or until audited by the State.

WORK STATEMENT

STATE agrees to:

- 1. Provide CSTI faculty to develop program content and an agenda for a Disaster Preparedness Mitigation Training Program, which may involve: two or more advance trips to Client's location to coordinate the program with Client's representative if determined and agreed necessary by CSTI & Client's representatives.
- 2. Conducting a needs assessment to determine the most appropriate instructional content to address the training needs of CLIENT.
- 3. Development of a program agenda.
- 4. Advising Client's representative on preparations to be accomplished at the local level.
- 5. Prepare and deliver printed course notebooks to complement the instruction presented in the training program.
- 6. Provide sufficient faculty and staff to support and deliver the training programs, according to the attached draft program agenda. Training will be conducted dates, times and locations mutually agreed between CSTI and Client.

CLIENT agrees to:

- 1. Appoint a representative to work with the CSTI Course Manager on all aspects of the training program.
- 2. Provide a copy of the resolution, order, or ordinance granting signature authority to contract for this program to the individual executing this agreement.
- 3. Provide suitable facilities for the training, to include the meeting/training rooms, an adjacent office or conference room for use by CSTI staff throughout the program, exercise areas (emergency operations center, simulator room, and media center) and audio-visual and communications equipment to support the program.
- 4. Identify and arrange for the attendance of program participants, local speakers, and exercise simulators as needed.
- 5. Ensure the full participation of the chief executive, department/program managers, and other appropriate staff in the preparatory stages and at the training program itself. Conduct registration of program participants and provide CSTI with a roster of attendees prior to the close of the program.
