BACKGROUND: The Riverside County Anti-Terrorism Approval Authority (ATTA) has recommended funding a Sheriff's Department project request submitted in response to the Riverside County Operational Area 2010 Homeland Security Grant Program. The ATTA has allocated to the Sheriff's Department \$1,070,347 for the project. The Department is now required to submit a grant application to the California Emergency Management Agency (Cal-EMA).

All applicants for FY10 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) are required to submit a new Authorized Agents and Application Approval Resolution with their FY10 HSGP application. Therefore, the attached resolution identifies the Department titles/positions that are designated Authorized Agents for the County of Riverside and who are required to complete transactions to obtain financial aid through the HSGP.

BACKGROUND continued:

The three rates charged to special districts are for processing timeshares and special assessments, whereas the other twenty three fees are for various property tax services rendered to the public.

The annual review of the existing fees has been calculated to recover the full cost of providing the services. Fourteen of the existing fees decreased, seven increased and five remained the same.
