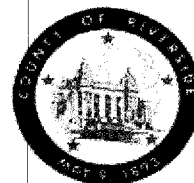

SUBJECT: Approve the Sole Source Agreement between the County of Riverside Department of Public Health (DOPH) and the Riverside County Childcare Consortium to evaluate the effectiveness of conducting and operating 2010-2011 childcare provider-based novel influenza A (H1N1) vaccination clinics.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Approve the Sole Source Agreement between the County of Riverside Department of Public Health (DOPH) and the Riverside County Child Care Consortium (RCCCC) from June 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 in the amount of \$114,400; and
- 2) Authorize the Purchasing Agent to issue a purchase order to Riverside County Childcare Consortium in the amount of \$114,400; and
- 3) Authorize the Auditor Controller to make adjustments to the 2010-2011 fiscal year budget as outlined in the attached Schedule A; and
- 4) Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign three (3) originals of said Agreement.

SUBJECT: Approve the Sole Source Agreement between the County of Riverside Department of Public Health (DOPH) and the Riverside County Childcare Consortium to evaluate the effectiveness of conducting and operating 2010-2011 childcare provider-based novel influenza A (H1N1) vaccination clinics.

BACKGROUND: In June 2009, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared a pandemic due to a novel influenza A (H1N1) virus. In November 2009, the Riverside County Department of Public Health (RCDOPH) activated its Department Operations Center (DOC) to coordinate activities in response to the H1N1 pandemic. During the response phase, RCDOPH scheduled vaccine clinics for childcare providers; however, not all childcare providers opted to participate in the vaccination campaign. The H1N1 outbreak has highlighted the need to evaluate the barriers and facilitators to partnering with RCDOPH to conduct and operate H1N1 vaccination clinics in childcare settings. The evaluation of this influenza pandemic will afford the opportunity to examine alternatives for response to future public health emergencies.

The Riverside County Child Care Consortium (RCCCC) is a service agency which provides advocacy and resources in the establishment and support of quality, affordable and accessible childcare services for children and families in Riverside County. For the evaluation component of the H1N1 Vaccination Campaign, RCCCC will disseminate and ensure completion of evaluation surveys by the ninety-two (92) childcare providers in Riverside County at which RCDOPH offered to provide vaccination clinics. In addition, RCCCC will contract with the ninety-two (92) childcare providers to provide them with a reimbursement for participating in the evaluation, completing the survey and hosting a vaccination clinic, if applicable. The reimbursement for hosting a vaccination clinic is for costs that the childcare provider may have incurred for facility usage, staff time, printing/photocopying consents or informational sheets, and supplies.

All ninety-two (92) childcare providers will receive a reimbursement of \$500 each for completing and submitting the survey; and twenty-nine (29) of these will receive an additional \$2,000 for their participation in hosting a vaccination clinic during the vaccination campaign. This is a total amount of \$104,000. RCCCC will make payment of the reimbursements to the childcare providers and will receive a payment of \$10,400 as an administrative fee for executing the contracts and providing funding to the childcare providers.

PRICE REASONABLENESS:

The cost for RCCCC to assist RCDOPH in completing this After Action Evaluation of childcare provider-based clinics for the 2009 H1N1 Vaccination Campaign is \$114,400. This amount includes a reimbursement for all childcare providers for hosting a vaccination clinic and/or for completing the evaluation survey. RCCCC will ensure that surveys are returned and will process the surveys for data entry and analysis. Using any other agency would be cost prohibitive as no other agency has access to the information to implement this project with childcare providers throughout the county.

Subject: Request for Sole Source Procurement for After Action Evaluation of the 2009 H1N1 Childcare Provider-Based Vaccination Campaign Efforts

The information below is provided in support of my Department requesting approval for a sole source contract. Outside of a duly declared emergency, the time to develop a statement of work or specifications is not in itself justification for sole source.

Supply/Service being requested: After Action Evaluation of Riverside County 2009 H1N1 Childcare Provider-Based Vaccination Campaign Efforts.

Supplier being requested:

Riverside County Child Care Consortium (RCCCC)
2010 Iowa Avenue, Suite 100
Riverside, California 92507

Alternative suppliers that can or might be able to provide supply/service:

The Riverside County Child Care Consortium (RCCCC) is a service agency which provides advocacy and resources in the establishment and support of quality, affordable and accessible childcare services for children and families in Riverside County. RCCCC provides leadership and guidance to local communities to establish childcare assistance programs. They are the only entity in the county that has existing, on-going relationships with all ninety-two (92) child care providers at which RCDOPH offered to provide vaccination clinics. If another organization was selected to conduct this evaluation, they would need to coordinate with RCCCC to gain access to information about the individual childcare providers.

Extent of market search conducted: Market research was conducted via the internet in an attempt to identify any other agencies that routinely coordinate and contract with childcare providers to provide support, information sharing and resources. RCCCC was identified as the agency best-positioned to support the campaign evaluation.

Unique feature of the supply/service being requested from this supplier that no alternative supplier can provide: The Riverside County Child Care Consortium is a service agency which supports the ninety-two (92) childcare providers at which RCDOPH offered to provide vaccination clinics. Since 1982, RCCCC has been mandated to administrate education funding and program development policies for the county's childcare providers. RCCCC was appointed as the Local Child Care and Development Planning Council for Riverside County and is primarily responsible for developing new childcare centers, providing community childcare resources, training childcare providers, and assisting planning departments with zoning, ordinance and regulation issues. Because of this presence in the community, RCCCC is uniquely positioned to assist RCDOPH in evaluating the effectiveness of the vaccination campaign at childcare providers. If another organization was selected to conduct this evaluation, they would need to coordinate with RCCCC to gain access to the individual childcare providers. Also, another agency would not have the unique perspective of how childcare providers function and the limitations that they face in coordinating childcare provider-based vaccination clinics.

Reasons why my department requires these unique features and what benefit will accrue to the County: PHEPR is conducting an After Action Evaluation to assess the effectiveness of conducting childcare provider-based vaccination clinics during the 2009 H1N1 Vaccination Campaign. This information will be included as part of an overall After Action Report (AAR) for the 2009 H1N1 Vaccination Campaign. This comprehensive AAR is required by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the California Department of Public Health as part of the Public Health Emergency Response (PHER) grants.

Price Reasonableness: The cost for RCCCC to assist RCDOPH in completing this After Action Evaluation of childcare provider-based clinics for the 2009 H1N1 Vaccination Campaign is \$114,400. This amount includes a reimbursement for all childcare providers for hosting a vaccination clinic and/or for completing the evaluation survey. RCCCC will ensure that surveys are returned and will process the surveys for data entry and analysis. Using any other agency would be cost prohibitive as no other agency has access to the information to implement this project with childcare providers throughout the county.

1 **1. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES**

2 **1.1** CONTRACTOR shall provide all services as outlined and specified in Exhibit A,
3 SCOPE OF WORK, attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.

4 **1.2** CONTRACTOR shall perform to the satisfaction of the COUNTY and in
5 conformance to and consistent with the highest standards of firms/professionals in
6 the same discipline in the State of California.

7 **1.3** CONTRACTOR affirms this is fully apprised of all the work to be performed under
8 this Agreement; and the CONTRACTOR agrees it can properly perform this work
9 at the prices stated in Exhibit B, PAYMENT PROVISION. CONTRACTOR is not
10 to perform services or provide products outside of this Agreement.

11 **1.4** Acceptance by the COUNTY of the CONTRACTOR'S performance under this
12 Agreement does not operate as a release of CONTRACTOR'S responsibility for
13 full compliance with the terms of this Agreement.
14

15 **2. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE**

16 **2.1** This Agreement shall be effective on June 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011, unless
17 terminated as specified in Section 14, TERMINATION.
18

19 **3. COMPENSATION.**

20 **3.1** In consideration of services provided by CONTRACTOR pursuant to Exhibit A,
21 SCOPE OF WORK, attached hereto and incorporated herein, CONTRACTOR
22 shall be entitled to receive payment as specified in Exhibit B, PAYMENT
23 PROVISIONS, attached hereto and incorporated herein. Maximum payment by
24 COUNTY to CONTRACTOR shall not exceed one hundred fourteen thousand
25 four hundred dollars (\$114,400), including all expenses.
26

27 **3.2** COUNTY is not responsible for any fees or cost incurred above or beyond the
28 contracted amount, as stated above in Section 3, COMPENSATION, Paragraph

1 3.1, and shall have no obligation to purchase any specified amount of services.
2 Unless otherwise specifically stated in Exhibit B, PAYMENT PROVISIONS,
3 COUNTY shall not be responsible for payment of any of CONTRACTOR'S
4 expenses related to this Agreement.

5 **3.3** COUNTY requires written proof satisfactory to COUNTY of cost increases prior
6 to any approved price adjustment. A minimum of 30-day advance notice in
7 writing is required to be considered and approved by COUNTY. No retroactive
8 price adjustments will be considered. Any price increases must be stated in a
9 written amendment to this Agreement.

10 **3.4** COUNTY obligation for payment of this Agreement beyond the current fiscal
11 year end is contingent upon and limited by the availability of COUNTY funding
12 from which payment can be made. No legal liability on the part of the COUNTY
13 shall rise for payment beyond June 30 of each calendar year unless funds are
14 made available for such payment. In the event such funds are not forthcoming for
15 any reason, COUNTY shall immediately notify CONTRACTOR in writing; and
16 this Agreement shall be deemed terminated and have no force and effect.
17

19 **4. HOLD HARMLESS/INDEMNIFICATION.**

20 **4.1** CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless the County of Riverside, its
21 Agencies, Districts, Special Districts and Departments, their respective directors,
22 officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, agents
23 and representatives from any liability, claim, damage or action whatsoever, based
24 or asserted upon any act or omission of CONTRACTOR, its officers, employees,
25 subcontractors, agents or representatives arising out of or in any way relating to
26 this Agreement, including but not limited to property damage, bodily injury, or
27 death. CONTRACTOR shall defend, at its sole cost and expense, including but
28

1 not limited to attorney fees, cost of investigation, defense and settlements or
2 awards, the County of Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts and
3 Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected
4 and appointed officials, employees, agents and representatives in any such action
5 or claim. With respect to any action or claim subject to indemnification herein by
6 CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall, at their sole cost, have the right to use
7 counsel of its own choice and shall have the right to adjust, settle, or compromise
8 any such action or claim without the prior consent of COUNTY; provided,
9 however, that any such adjustment, settlement or compromise in no manner
10 whatsoever limits or circumscribes CONTRACTOR'S indemnification of
11 COUNTY. CONTRACTOR'S obligation hereunder shall be satisfied when
12 CONTRACTOR has provided to COUNTY the appropriate form of dismissal (or
13 similar document) relieving COUNTY from any liability for the action or claim
14 involved.

15 **4.2** The specified insurance limits required in this Agreement shall in no way limit or
16 circumscribe CONTRACTOR'S obligations to indemnify and hold harmless
17 COUNTY.

18 **4.3** In the event there is conflict between this clause and California Civil Code
19 Section 2782, this clause shall be interpreted to comply with Civil Code 2782.
20 Such interpretation shall not relieve the CONTRACTOR from indemnifying the
21 COUNTY to the fullest extent allowed by law.

22
23 **5. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.**

24 **5.1** The CONTRACTOR is, for the purpose relating to this Agreement, an
25 independent CONTRACTOR and shall not be deemed an employee of the
26 COUNTY. It is expressly understood and agreed that the CONTRACTOR
27 (including its employees, agents and subcontractors) shall in no event be entitled
28 to any benefits to which COUNTY employees are entitled, including but not

1 limited overtime, any retirement benefits, worker's compensation benefits, and
 2 injury leave or other leave benefits. There shall be no employer-employee
 3 relationship between the parties; and CONTRACTOR shall hold COUNTY
 4 harmless from any and all claims that parties; and CONTRACTOR shall hold
 5 COUNTY harmless from any and all claims that may be made against COUNTY
 6 based upon any contention by a third party that an employer-employee
 7 relationship exists by reason of this Agreement. It is further understood and
 8 agreed by the parties that CONTRACTOR in the performance of this Agreement.

9 **5.2** It is further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that CONTRACTOR in
 10 the performance of this Agreement is subject to the control or direction of
 11 COUNTY merely as to the result to be accomplished by the services hereunder
 12 agree to render and perform and not as to the means and methods for
 13 accomplishing the results.

14 **6. LIABILITY INSURANCE** Without limiting or diminishing the CONTRACTOR'S
 15 obligation to indemnify or hold the COUNTY harmless, CONTRACTOR shall procure
 16 and maintain or cause to be maintained, at its sole cost and expense, the following
 17 insurance coverage's during the term of this Agreement:

18 **6.1 Workers' Compensation:**

19 If the CONTRACTOR has employees as defined by the State of California, the
 20 CONTRACTOR shall maintain statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance
 21 (Coverage A) as prescribed by the laws of the State of California. Policy shall
 22 include Employers' Liability (Coverage B) including Occupational Disease with
 23 limits not less than \$1,000,000 per person per accident. The policy shall be endorsed
 24 to waive subrogation in favor of The County of Riverside, and, if applicable, to
 25 provide a Borrowed Servant/Alternate Employer Endorsement.

26 **6.2 Commercial General Liability:**

27 Commercial General Liability insurance coverage, including but not limited to,
 28 premises liability, contractual liability, products and completed operations

1 liability, personal and advertising injury covering claims which may arise from or out
2 of CONTRACTOR'S performance of its obligations hereunder. Policy shall name all
3 Agencies, Districts, Special Districts, and Departments of the COUNTY of Riverside,
4 their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, employees, elected or
5 appointed officials, agents or representatives as Additional Insureds. Policy's limit of
6 liability shall not be less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If
7 such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this
8 agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit.

9 **6.3 Vehicle Liability:**

10 If vehicles or mobile equipment are used in the performance of the obligations
11 under this Agreement, then CONTRACTOR shall maintain liability insurance for
12 all owned, non-owned or hired vehicles so used in an amount not less than
13 \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a
14 general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this agreement or be no less
15 than two (2) times the occurrence limit. Policy shall name the County of
16 Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts, and Departments, their
17 respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, employees, elected or
18 appointed officials, agents or representatives as Additional Insureds.

19 **6.4 General Insurance Provisions - All lines:**

20 **6.4.1** Any insurance carrier providing insurance coverage hereunder shall be
21 admitted to the State of California and have an A M BEST rating of not
22 less than A: VIII (A:8) unless such requirements are waived, in writing, by
23 the County Risk Manager. If the County's Risk Manager waives a
24 requirement for a particular insurer such waiver is only valid for that
25 specific insurer and only for one policy term.

26 **6.4.2** The CONTRACTOR must declare its insurance self-insured retentions. If
27 such self-insured retentions exceed \$500,000 per occurrence such
28 retentions shall have the prior written consent of the County Risk Manager

1 before the commencement of operations under this Agreement. Upon
2 notification of self insured retention unacceptable to the COUNTY, and at
3 the election of the County's Risk Manager, CONTRACTOR'S carriers
4 shall either; 1) reduce or eliminate such self-insured retention as respects
5 this Agreement with the COUNTY, or 2) procure a bond which guarantees
6 payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and
7 defense costs and expenses.

8 **6.4.3** CONTRACTOR shall cause CONTRACTOR'S insurance carrier(s) to
9 furnish the County of Riverside with either 1) a properly executed original
10 Certificate(s) of Insurance and certified original copies of Endorsements
11 effecting coverage as required herein, or 2) if requested to do so orally
12 or in writing by the County Risk Manager, provide original Certified
13 copies of policies including all Endorsements and all attachments thereto,
14 showing such insurance is in full force and effect. Further, said
15 Certificate(s) and policies of insurance shall contain the covenant of the
16 insurance carrier(s) that thirty (30) days written notice shall be given to the
17 County of Riverside prior to any material modification, cancellation,
18 expiration or reduction in coverage of such insurance. In the event of a
19 material modification, cancellation, expiration, or reduction in coverage,
20 this Agreement shall terminate forthwith, unless the County of Riverside
21 receives, prior to such effective date, another properly executed original
22 Certificate of Insurance and original copies of endorsements or certified
23 original policies, including all endorsements and attachments thereto
24 evidencing coverage's set forth herein and the insurance required herein is
25 in full force and effect. *CONTRACTOR shall not commence operations*
26 *until the COUNTY has been furnished original Certificate (s) of Insurance*
27 *and certified original copies of endorsement or policy of insurance*
28 *including all endorsements and any and all other attachments as required*

1 *in this Section. An individual authorized by the insurance carrier to do so*
 2 *on its behalf shall sign the original endorsements for each policy and the*
 3 *Certificate of Insurance.*

4 **6.4.4** It is understood and agreed to by the parties hereto and the insurance
 5 company(s), that the Certificate(s) of insurance and policies shall so
 6 covenant and shall be construed as primary insurance, and the COUNTY'S
 7 insurance and/or deductibles and/or self-insured retention's or self-insured
 8 programs shall not be construed as contributory.

9 **6.4.5** The COUNTY'S Reserved Rights –Insurance. If, during the term of this
 10 Agreement or any extension thereof, there is a material change in the
 11 scope of services; or, there is a material change in the equipment to be
 12 used in the performance of the scope of work (such as the use of aircraft or
 13 watercraft) the COUNTY reserves the right to adjust the type of insurance
 14 required herein, if; in the COUNTY Risk Manager's reasonable judgment
 15 the amount or type of insurance carried by the CONTRACTOR has
 16 become inadequate

17 **6.4.6** CONTRACTOR shall pass down the insurance obligations contained
 18 herein to all tiers of subcontractors working under this Agreement.

19 **6.4.7** The insurance requirements contained in this Agreement may be met with
 20 a program(s) of self-insurance acceptable to the COUNTY.

21
 22 **7. LICENSE.**

23 **7.1** CONTRACTOR shall, through the term of this Agreement, maintain all licenses
 24 necessary for the provision of the services hereunder and required by the laws and
 25 regulations of the United States, the State of California, County of Riverside, and
 26 all other governmental agencies. CONTRACTOR shall notify COUNTY
 27 immediately, in writing, of inability to obtain or maintain such license. Said
 28 inability shall be cause for termination of this Agreement.

1 7.2 CONTRACTOR shall ensure that CONTRACTOR'S employees, agents and
2 other CONTRACTOR'S performing services under the terms of this Agreement
3 are in compliance with all relative licensing requirements. CONTRACTOR
4 hereby agrees to notify COUNTY immediately, in writing, of inability of
5 CONTRACTOR or any of CONTRACTOR'S employees, agents and other
6 CONTRACTOR'S, to obtain or maintain such license(s). Said inability shall be
7 cause for termination of this Agreement.

8 7.3 A copy of each such license, permit, approval, waiver, exemption, registration,
9 accreditation, and certificate shall be provided to COUNTY.

10 **8. RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS.**

11 8.1 CONTRACTOR shall make available, upon written request by any duly authorized
12 Federal, State or COUNTY agency, a copy of this Agreement and such books,
13 documents and records as are necessary to certify the nature and extent of the
14 CONTRACTOR'S costs related to this Agreement. All such books, documents and
15 records shall be maintained by CONTRACTOR for at least five years following
16 termination of this Agreement and be available for audit by the COUNTY.
17 CONTRACTOR shall provide to the COUNTY reports and information related to
18 this Agreement.

19
20 **9. OSHA REGULATIONS**

21 9.1 CONTRACTOR hereby certifies awareness of the Occupational Safety and Health
22 Administration (OSHA) standards and codes as set forth by the U.S. Department of
23 Labor, and the derivative Cal/OSHA standards, laws and regulations relating
24 thereto, and verifies that all performance under this Agreement shall be in
25 compliance therewith.

26
27 **10. CONFIDENTIALITY**

1 **10.1** CONTRACTOR shall not use for personal gain or make other improper use of
2 privileged or confidential information which is acquired in connection with this
3 Agreement. The term "privileged or confidential information" includes but is not
4 limited to: unpublished or sensitive technological or scientific information;
5 medical, personnel, or security records; anticipated material requirements or
6 pricing/purchasing actions; COUNTY information or data which is not subject to
7 public disclosure; COUNTY operational procedures; and knowledge of selection of
8 contractors, subcontractors or suppliers in advance of official announcement.

9 **10.2** CONTRACTOR shall protect from unauthorized disclosure names and other
10 identifying information concerning persons receiving services pursuant to this
11 Agreement, except for general statistical information not identifying any person.
12 CONTRACTOR shall not use such information for any purpose other than carrying
13 out the CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Agreement. The CONTRACTOR
14 shall promptly transmit to the COUNTY all third party requests for disclosure of
15 such information. The CONTRACTOR shall not disclose, except as otherwise
16 specifically permitted by this Agreement or authorized in advance in writing by the
17 COUNTY, any such information to anyone other than the COUNTY. For purposes
18 of this paragraph, identity shall include, but not be limited to name, identifying
19 number, symbol, or other identifying particular assigned to the individual, such as
20 finger or voice print or a photograph.

21
22
23 **10.3 HEALTH INSURANCE PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT**

24 **(HIPAA)** - The Contractor in this Agreement is subject to all relevant requirements
25 contained in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996
26 (HIPAA), Public Law 104-91, enacted August 21, 1996, and the laws and
27 regulations promulgated subsequent thereto. The Contractor hereto agrees to
28 cooperate in accordance with the terms and intent of this Agreement for

1 implementation of relevant law(s) and/or regulation(s) promulgated under this Law.
 2 The Contractor further agrees that it shall be in compliance, and shall remain in
 3 compliance with the requirements of HIPAA, and the laws and regulations
 4 promulgated subsequent hereto, as may be amended from time to time.

5
 6 **11. CONDUCT OF CONTRACTOR.**

7 **11.1** CONTRACTOR covenants that it presently has no interest, including, but not
 8 limited to, other projects or contracts, and shall not acquire any such interest, direct
 9 or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with CONTRACTOR'S
 10 performance under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR agrees to inform the
 11 COUNTY of all the CONTRACTOR'S interests, if any, which are or may be
 12 perceived as incompatible with the COUNTY'S interest

13 **11.2** CONTRACTOR shall not, under circumstances which could be interpreted as an
 14 attempt to influence the recipient in the conduct of his duties, accept any gratuity or
 15 special favor from individuals or firms with whom the CONTRACTOR is doing
 16 business or proposing to do business, in accomplishing the work under this
 17 Agreement.

18 **11.3** CONTRACTOR or its employees shall not offer gifts, gratuity, favors, and
 19 entertainment directly or indirectly to COUNTY employees.
 20

21 **12. INSPECTION OF SERVICE; QUALITY CONTROL/ASSURANCE**

22 **12.1** All performances (which includes services, workmanship, materials, supplies and
 23 equipment furnished or utilized in the performance of this Agreement) shall be
 24 subject to inspection and test by the COUNTY or other regulatory agencies at all
 25 times. CONTRACTOR shall provide adequate cooperation to any inspector or
 26 other COUNTY representative to permit him/her to determine the
 27 CONTRACTOR'S conformity with the terms of this Agreement. If any services
 28 performed or products provided by CONTRACTOR are not in conformance with

1 the terms of this Agreement, the COUNTY shall have the right to require the
2 CONTRACTOR to perform the services or provide the products in conformance
3 with the terms of the Agreement at no additional cost to the COUNTY. When
4 the services to be performed or the products to be provided are of such nature that
5 the difference cannot be corrected, the COUNTY shall have the right to 1) require
6 the CONTRACTOR immediately to take all necessary steps to ensure future
7 performance in conformity with the terms of the Agreement; and/or 2) reduce the
8 Agreement price to reflect the reduced value of the services performed or
9 products provided. COUNTY may also terminate this Agreement for default and
10 charge to CONTRACTOR any costs incurred by the COUNTY because of the
11 CONTRACTOR'S failure to perform.

12 **12.2** CONTRACTOR shall establish adequate procedures for self-monitoring and
13 quality control and assurance to ensure proper performance under this Agreement;
14 and shall permit a COUNTY representative or other regulatory official to monitor,
15 assess or evaluate CONTRACTOR'S performance under this Agreement at any
16 time upon reasonable notice to CONTRACTOR.

17
18 **13. DISPUTES**

19 **13.1** The parties shall attempt to resolve any disputes amicably the working level. If
20 that is not successful, the dispute shall be referred to the senior management of the
21 parties. Any dispute relating to this Agreement which is not resolved by the
22 parties shall be decided by the COUNTY'S Purchasing Department's Compliance
23 Contract Officer shall be the final and conclusive unless determined by a court of
24 competent jurisdiction to have been fraudulent, capricious, arbitrary, or so grossly
25 erroneous as necessarily to imply bad faith. CONTRACTOR shall proceed
26 diligently with the performance of this Agreement pending the resolution of a
27 dispute.

28 **13.2** Prior to the filing of any legal action related to this Agreement, the parties shall be

1 obligated to attend a mediation session in Riverside County before a neutral third
2 party mediator. A second mediation session shall be required if the first session is
3 not successful. The parties shall share the cost of the mediations.

4
5 **14. TERMINATION.**

6 **14.1** COUNTY may terminate this Agreement without cause upon 30 days written
7 notice served upon the CONTRACTOR stating the extent and effective date of
8 termination.

9 **14.2** COUNTY may, upon five (5) days written notice, terminate this agreement for
10 CONTRACTOR'S default, if CONTRACTOR refuses or fails to comply with the
11 terms of this Agreement or fails to make progress so as to endanger performance
12 and does not immediately cure such failure. In the event of such termination, the
13 COUNTY may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by
14 COUNTY.

15 **14.3** After receipt of the notice of termination, CONTRACTOR shall:

16 **14.3.1** Stop all work under this Agreement on the date specified in the notice of
17 termination;

18 **14.3.2** Transfer to COUNTY and deliver in the manner as directed by
19 COUNTY any materials, reports or other products which, if the
20 Agreement had been completed or continued, would have been required
21 to be furnished to COUNTY.

22 **14.4** After termination, COUNTY shall make payment for CONTRACTOR'S
23 performed up to the date of termination in accordance with this Agreement and at
24 the rates set forth in Exhibit B, Payment Provision.

25 **14.5** CONTRACTOR'S rights under this Agreement shall terminate (except for fees
26 accrued prior to the date of termination) upon dishonesty or a willful or material
27 breach of this Agreement by CONTRACTOR; or in the event CONTRACTOR'S
28 unwillingness or inability for any reasons whatsoever to perform the terms of this
Agreement. In such event, CONTRACTOR shall not be entitled to any further

1 compensation under this Agreement.

2 **14.6** The rights and remedies of COUNTY provided in this section shall not be
3 exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or
4 under this Agreement.

5 **15. FORCE MAJEURE**

6 **15.1** Neither Party shall be liable nor deemed to be in default for any delay or failure
7 in performance under this Agreement or other interruption of service or
8 employment deemed resulting, directly or indirectly, from acts of God.

9 **16. NONDISCRIMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY**

10 **16.1** CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate in the provision of services, allocation of
11 benefits, accommodation in facilities, or employment of personnel, on the basis of
12 ethnic group identification, race, color, creed, ancestry, religion, national origin,
13 physical handicap, medical condition, or sex in the performance of this
14 Agreement; and, to the extent they shall be found to be applicable hereto, shall
15 comply with the provisions of California Fair Employment and Housing Act
16 (Gov. Code 12900 et. Seq.), the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352),
17 the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §1210 et. Seq.) and all
18 other applicable laws or regulations.

19
20 **17. CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

21 **17.1** CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S employees shall have no interest, and
22 shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which will conflict in any manner
23 or degree with the performance of services required under this Agreement.

24
25 **18. ALTERATION**

26 **18.1** No alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless
27 made in writing and signed by the parties hereto, and no oral understanding or
28 agreement not incorporated herein, shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.

1 **18.2** Only the County Board of Supervisors or the County Purchasing Agent may
2 authorize any alteration or revision of this Agreement. The parties expressly
3 recognize that COUNTY personnel are without authorization to either change or
4 waive any requirements of this Agreement.

5 **18.3** This Agreement including any attachments or exhibits, constitutes the entire
6 Agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter and supersedes all prior
7 and contemporaneous representations, proposals, discussions and communications,
8 whether oral or in writing. This Agreement may be changed or modified only by a
9 written amendment signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

10
11 **19. ASSIGNMENT/SUBCONTRACTORS**

12 **19.1** CONTRACTOR may not delegate or assign any interest in this Agreement,
13 whether by operation of law or otherwise, without the prior written consent of
14 COUNTY. Any attempt to delegate or assign any interest herein shall be deemed
15 void and of no force or effect.

16 **19.2** No contract shall be made by the CONTRACTOR with any other party for
17 furnishing any of the work or service under this Agreement without the prior
18 written approval of the COUNTY; but this provision shall not require the approval
19 of contracts of employment between the CONTRACTOR and personnel assigned
20 under this Agreement, or for parties named in the proposal and agreed to under
21 this Agreement.

22
23
24 **20. ADMINISTRATION.** The COUNTY Purchasing Agent, or designee, shall administer
25 this Agreement on behalf of the COUNTY. The Purchasing Department is to serve as the
26 liaison with CONTRACTOR in connection with this Agreement.

27
28 **21. WAIVER.**

1 Any waiver by COUNTY of any breach of any one or more of the terms of this
2 Agreement shall not be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent or other breach of the
3 same or of any other term thereof. Failure on the part of the COUNTY to require exact,
4 full and complete compliance with any terms of this Agreement shall not be construed as
5 in any manner changing the terms hereof or stopping COUNTY from enforcement
6 hereof.

7
8 **22. JURISDICTION/VENUE**

9 This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the
10 State of California. CONTRACTOR agrees and consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of
11 the courts of the State of California for all purposes regarding this Agreement and further
12 agrees and consents that venue of any action brought hereunder shall be exclusively in
13 the County of Riverside, California.

14
15 **23. SEVERABILITY**

16 **23.1** If any provision in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to
17 be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless
18 continue in full force without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

19
20 **24. CAPTIONS AND PARAGRAPH HEADINGS.** Captions and paragraph headings
21 used in this Agreement are for convenience only and are not a part of this Agreement and
22 shall not be used in construing this Agreement.

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EXHIBIT A**SCOPE OF WORK****1. BACKGROUND:**

In November 2009, the County of Riverside through its Community Health Agency, Department of Public Health hereinafter referred to as (“COUNTY”), activated its Department Operations Center (DOC) to coordinate activities in response to the H1N1 pandemic. During the response phase, COUNTY scheduled vaccine clinics for childcare providers. Not all childcare providers opted to participate and schedule COUNTY-operated clinics. The H1N1 outbreak has highlighted the need to evaluate the barriers and facilitators to partnering with COUNTY to conduct and operate H1N1 vaccination clinics in childcare settings. The evaluation of the influenza pandemic will afford the opportunity to examine alternatives for response to future public health emergencies.

For this evaluation COUNTY will partner with the Riverside County Child Care Consortium hereinafter referred to as (“CONTRACTOR”), to assess factors that affected participation during the 2009-2010 H1N1 vaccination campaign. In particular, CONTRACTOR will assist COUNTY in surveying childcare providers to identify reason that a childcare provider elected or declined to conduct H1N1 vaccination clinics.

The information and recommendations from this report will be used to develop strategic guidance for future pandemic influenza events and improve COUNTY’S pandemic response plans.

2. EVALUTION RESPONSIBILITIES:**2.1 COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- 2.1.1** Develop a survey instrument to assess ninety-two (92) childcare providers for barriers of facilitators for conducting school-based vaccination clinics.
- 2.1.2** Create the survey in Survey Monkey, an online survey and questionnaire tool.

1 **2.1.3** Obtain Point of Contact information, including e-mail and physical
2 addresses, for the ninety-two (92) childcare providers that were contacted
3 during 2009-2010 vaccination campaign.

4 **2.1.4** Develop cover letters to be used by the CONTRACTOR to inform the
5 ninety-two (92) childcare providers of the evaluation and solicit their
6 participation.

7 **2.1.5** Track survey completion progress of the ninety-two (92) childcare
8 providers.

9 **2.1.6** Provide the CONTRACTOR with funds to disseminate to the ninety-two
10 childcare providers. These stipends are for completing the assessment
11 survey and for hosting vaccination clinics, if applicable. A breakdown for
12 the distribution of funds by CONTRACTOR is included in Exhibit A.

13 **2.1.7** Coordinate the evaluation of the survey results and the development of an
14 evaluation report for childcare provider-based vaccination clinics in
15 Riverside County.

16 **2.2 CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES:**

17 **2.2.1** Review and provide feedback on the survey instrument by June 21, 2010.

18 **2.2.2** Inform the ninety-two (92) childcare providers of the evaluation and
19 solicit their participation.

20 **2.2.3** Provide the ninety-two (92) childcare providers with a link to the survey
21 through Survey Monkey by June 23, 2010. (Survey Monkey link to be
22 provided by COUNTY.)

23 **2.2.4** Coordinate with COUNTY to track survey completion progress of the
24 ninety-two (92) childcare providers and provide follow-up with non-
25 respondents when necessary.

26 **2.2.5** Receive a final report by July 27, 2010.

27 **2.2.6** Disseminate stipends to the ninety-two (92) childcare providers according
28 to Exhibit A. If a childcare provider does not return the survey by the date

1 required by CONTRACTOR/COUNTY, that childcare provider forfeits
2 payment and the funds will be redistributed evenly among the participating
3 entities.

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EXHIBIT B**PAYMENT PROVISIONS**

Contractor shall be entitled to receive payment for services rendered as specific in Exhibit A, as follows:

1. Amount Awarded

1.1 This Agreement is in an amount not to exceed **\$114,400**.

2. Payment Request Process

2.1 COUNTY shall reimburse CONTRACTOR for services performed 30 NET working days after submission of invoice by CONTRACTOR. COUNTY is not responsible for any costs incurred above or beyond the Agreement amount.

2.2 Said reimbursement to CONTRACTOR shall be in accordance with periodic payment requests invoices, and other supporting documentation submitted to COUNTY by CONTRACTOR. Supporting documentation will be in the form of copies of original invoices, receipts, and survey reports.

2.4 CONTRACTOR shall ensure that grant funds are only used for allowable, fair, and reasonable costs.

2.5 CONTRACTOR shall promptly return to COUNTY all funds received which exceed the approved, actual expenditures as identified in this Agreement.
