RE: Board Initiation of an Amendment to County Ordinance No. 348 to Incorporate Statutorily Mandated Provisions for Emergency Shelters.

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BACKGROUND:

Government Code section 65583 requires each jurisdiction to identify a zone or zones where emergency shelters are allowed as a permitted use without a conditional use or other discretionary permit. Under the section, the identified zone or zones shall include sufficient capacity to accommodate the need for emergency shelter and the local government shall include a program to amend its zoning ordinance to meet the requirements of this paragraph within one year of the adoption of its housing element.

An order to initiate an amendment to County Ordinance No. 348 is requested to include emergency shelters as a permitted use in the Industrial Park (I-P) zone along with appropriate development standards.

Under Board Policy A-67, the Board of Supervisors is to consider the costs associated with preparing, processing and implementing an ordinance amendment in deciding whether to adopt an order initiating the amendment.
