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BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to the Local Cooperation Agreement (LCA) for the Santa Ana River Mainstem Project below Prado Dam, between the District and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), the District is required to provide for utility relocations and adjustments necessary for the construction of the subject project. The Corps awarded the construction contract for Reach 9, Phase 2B of the subject project in September 30, 2009 and is finalizing their design for Phase 2A. The District is working diligently with the Corps staff and the utility companies to ensure that the required utilities will be relocated and/or adjusted in time. In addition, the District is working with the Riverside County Transportation Commission since portions of the Corps' bank protection project is benefiting the widening of the State Route 91 project.
