RECOMMENDED MOTION: The Board:

1. Approve the contract documents for the Excavation and Removal of Material from the Badlands Landfill; and
2. Authorize the General Manager-Chief Engineer to re-advertise for bids for the Excavation and Removal of Material

BACKGROUND: On May 4, 2010, the Waste Management Department (Department) received approval from the Board of Supervisors to advertise for bids for the Excavation and Removal of Material from the Badlands Landfill. As none of the bids submitted to the Department were economically feasible, all bids were rejected accordingly. Given recent renewed interest in the material from local construction projects, the Department requests permission to re-advertise for bids for the Excavation and Removal of Material from the Badlands Sanitary Landfill. The project covered by this contract is for certain construction work affecting earthwork, excavation, and material removal in anticipation of the Canyon 4 Phase 3 (C4P3) Badlands Landfill liner expansion project. Approximately 185,000 cubic yards of native soil will need to be removed to complete the earthwork portion for the C4P3 liner expansion.

Potential local market demand for available clean fill material will result in no cost to the Department for the materials removal and possibly a payment to the Department for removal of the material based on the Department's prior experience with off-site material hauls. Material removal now will expedite completion of the C4P3 liner expansion project and eliminate costly double-handling of the material onsite. Due to uncertain soil market conditions, the engineer's credit estimate for the removal cannot be approximated at this time.

The Department has contacted the Riverside County Flood Control District (Flood) and Transportation Department (Transportation) to determine if they have a need for excess material. At this time, Flood is not in need of material in the vicinity of the landfill. Transportation may have a future need for material and the Department will ensure excess material is reserved for them and work with them to provide material, if necessary.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

The Badlands Landfill liner expansion project was considered under Environmental Assessment (EA) No. 37161, for which a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program was approved by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors in 1998. The Project will not exceed the daily maximum truck loads as assessed in the EA.
