BACKGROUND:

Children deserve to be raised in loving families with parents who protect and nurture them. For some children, adoption is their best chance for a healthy and happy life.

Each year, November is recognized as National Adoption Recognition Month to celebrate adoptive families and bring awareness to the many children awaiting permanent loving families.

From January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009, 585 adoptions were finalized and children have been connected to permanent families through Riverside County Children's Services.

BACKGROUND CONTINUED:

One of the Federal and State outcome measures requires counties to increase the number of adoptions completed within 24 months of removal from the home. Of all the children adopted in Riverside County, 31% were adopted within 24 months, which is above the state average of 28%.

Despite our efforts to ensure that children do not linger in foster care and receive families whom they may call their own, there are still children in foster care awaiting permanent adoptive homes.

Currently, in Riverside County there are 547 children awaiting permanent adoptive homes.

This proclamation serves to commend Riverside County adoptive parents for their significant contributions to strengthening and improving our families and communities. It also serves to provide awareness for children still awaiting permanent adoptive homes and the need to continue efforts to decrease the number of children waiting to be adopted.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact associated with this proclamation.
