## **BACKGROUND:**

In early February 2009 District maintenance staff performed a grading operation along the northerly bank of the Santa Ana River in the vicinity of the Market Street Bridge. One or more of the large Caterpillar dozers inadvertently and unknowingly drove over and damaged an existing 15-inch diameter waterline operated by the Jurupa Ditch Company. Once the Jurupa Ditch Company discovered the initial damage, repairs were initiated. Testing and repairs continued over a period of several months as additional damage was discovered along the line. On June 1, 2010 the Jurupa Ditch Company submitted a claim for reimbursement through the Riverside County Clerk to the Board. The claim was rejected pursuant to Government Code 911.2 because it was not presented within six months after the event or occurrence as required by law.

The District respectfully recommends that the Board accept the late claim, and authorize the District to directly reimburse the utility operator for costs incurred to repair their waterline. The District does not dispute the fact that the damage was directly attributable to our operations.
