3. Authorize the Auditor-Controller to adjust appropriations and estimated revenue as outlined in Schedule A.

BACKGROUND: The California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) and the Federal Department of Homeland Security Information Analysis and Infrastructure Protection Directorate provide protective action BZPP equipment and management funding to Operational Areas to protect and secure critical infrastructure and key resource sites across the country.

SUBJECT: FY09 Buffer Zone Protection Plan Grant (BZPP), Acceptance of Award and Designation of Authorized Agents

BACKGROUND (Continued):

BZPP is designed to reduce vulnerabilities to sites by extending the protected area around a site into the surrounding community and supporting the prevention and preparedness efforts of local law enforcement first responders. Riverside County Operational Area will receive pass-through funding on behalf of the first responders in the County Sheriff's Department to harden a federally-determined law enforcement sensitive critical infrastructure in Riverside County. On December 22, 2010 Riverside County Operational Area received notification of spending approval for a total of \$199,820. \$194,000 of this funding will be passed through to Riverside County Sheriff's Department to purchase equipment and \$5,820 will be retained by Riverside County Fire Department for local administrative fees. In accordance with federal regulations, the name and address of the site may not be disclosed in order to mitigate the threat risk from such disclosure.
