

RE: Cooperative Agreement between the County of Riverside (County) and County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) for the Corona Drains East Ontario Avenue Storm Drain, Stage 2

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completion the District will assume ownership, operation and maintenance of the project's mainline storm drains greater than 36-inches in diameter.

The District is funding all storm drain, right-of-way, construction and its inspection costs.

The County Transportation Department is obtaining and granting the District the necessary rights-of-way to construct, operate and maintain the project within County road right-of-ways and, upon completion of project construction, Transportation will assume ownership, operation and maintenance of the project's associated catch basins, connector pipes and storm drain segments that are 36-inches or smaller in diameter.

County Counsel has approved the Agreement as to legal form. A companion item appears on the Flood Control District's agenda this same date.
