- 1) Ratify the Agreement #7252 between Western Michigan University and Riverside County Community Health Agency, Department of Public Health, WIC Nutrition Program in the amount of \$ 429,000 for the period of January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2012; and
- 2) Authorize the Chairman of the Board to sign four (4) originals of the Agreement; and
- 3) Authorize the Chairman of the board to sign four (4) originals of the sole source agreement running for multiple years with Western Michigan University (WMU) in the amount of \$ 429,000 for the period of January 1,2011 through December 31, 2012; and
- 4) Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign subsequent amendments not to exceed authorized amount, including extension amendments until December 31, 2016.

BACKGROUND: WMU has the only State approved on-line WIC program in use right now and is a vendor based system that is handled completely by WMU (developed by EHealth Innovations Group at the WMU).

The purpose of this website is to provide stage-based, client-centered, WIC nutrition education to WIC clients. It is also used by WIC professionals to engage in an online tutorial to enhance skills related to motivational negotiation and assessing a client's stage of change. Motivational negotiation is particularly important for use in a clinic environment. The Wichealth.org training experience helps WIC professionals incorporate skills learned into WIC counseling sessions.

On-line WIC education will result in cost savings to our WIC program. Clients will have the option to choose on-line education rather than attend a classroom WIC education session at their local WIC site. WIC site education requires a qualified staff member to teach the class to approximately 15-20 participants per class. On-line education will reduce the number of class sessions needed at the WIC site and will reduce the number of educators needed per site.

FINANCIAL INFROMATION: The Department of Public Health, Community Health Agency WIC Program receives 100% of its funding from the State as a pass through from the Federal government. The WIC Program year is based on a federal fiscal year (October 1, 2010 – September 30, 2011)

PRICE REASONABLENESS: WMU has the only State approved on-line WIC program in use right now and is a vendor based system that is handled completely by WMU. This is a highly significant cost savings to the County and State as it negates the need for the County or State to set up its own WIC network systems consisting of dedicated servers, website, and administrative services to execute upon.

The State of Michigan and the State of Utah have similar contracts with similar rates that are being charged to the County of Riverside. No other sources known possess this kind of system.

On-line WIC education will result in cost savings to our WIC program. Clients will, have the option to choose on-line education rather than attend a classroom WIC education session at their local WIC site. WIC site education requires a qualified staff member to teach the class to approximately 15-20 participants per class. On-line education will reduce the number of class sessions needed at the WIC site and will reduce the number of educators needed per site.

The information below is provided in support of my Department requesting approval for a sole source contract. Outside of a duly declared emergency, the time to develop a statement of work or specifications is not in itself justification for sole source.

Supply/Service being requested: During January 1, 2011 – December 31, 2012 Western Michigan University shall: (1) provide a 2-year subscription to pilot wichealth.org for California WIC participants; (2) develop online modules on Baby Behavior with content based on the UC Davis Lactation Center's Baby Behavior Project; and (3) develop a virtual breastfeeding peer counseling system for California peer counselors and their respective participants.

Alternative suppliers that can or might be able to provide supply/service: WMU has the only State approved on-line WIC program in use right now and is a vendor based system that is handled completely by WMU. The California Department of Public Health WIC program has issued an Authorize to Spend (ATS) letter dated November 8, 2010, specifically requesting use of supplier requested for these services.

The State recommends that we implement and subscribe to the "on-line" pilot for nutritional educational modules for WIC participants on baby behavior and develop a virtual breastfeeding peer counseling system for peer counselors and their respective participants. Program coordinator for the project is CDPH, WIC.

Extent of market search conducted: Research was conducted using the Internet and sources from California Department of Public Health, WIC and USDA, Food and Nutrition Services, WIC Program. WMU has the only State approved on-line WIC program in use right now and is a vendor based system that is handled completely by WMU.

Unique feature of the supply/service being requested from this supplier that no alternative supplier can provide: WMU has the only State approved on-line WIC program in use right now and is a vendor based system that is handled completely by WMU. This is a highly significant cost savings to the County and State as it negates the need for the County or State to set up its own WIC network systems consisting of dedicated servers, website, and administrative services to execute upon. No other sources known possess this kind of system.

Reasons why my department requires these unique features and what benefit will accrue to the County: On-line WIC education will result in cost savings to our WIC program. Clients will have the option to choose on-line education rather than attend a classroom WIC education session at their local WIC site. WIC site education requires a qualified staff member to teach the class to approximately 15-20 participants per class. On-line education will reduce the number of class sessions needed at the WIC site and will reduce the number of educators needed per site.

Price Reasonableness: Total charges are not to exceed \$429,000 for FY 2010/2011, while services will continue through 12/31/2012. 100% grant funded through State of California for WIC. The State of Michigan and the State of Utah have similar contracts with similar rates that are being charged to the County of Riverside.

WMU has the only State approved on-line WIC program in use right now and is a vendor based system that is handled completely by WMU. This is a highly significant cost savings to the County and State as it negates the need for the County or State to set up its own WIC network systems consisting of dedicated servers, website, and administrative services to execute upon. No other sources known possess this kind of system.

PROJECT AGREEMENT

This agreement, made and entered into this December 7 day of 2010, by and between The Board of Trustees of Western Michigan University (hereinafter known as WMU) and the State of California Department of Public Health represented by the County of Riverside Community Health Agency (hereinafter known as the Second Party). WMU is a constitutional body corporate organized and existing under the constitution of the State of Michigan, with offices in the city of Kalamazoo, Michigan. Second Party is organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, with offices in Riverside.

- 1. RECITALS. WMU has experience and expertise that are valuable to Second Party. Second Party desires to retain WMU to perform the scope of work described in Appendix A for which WMU will bill Second Party quarterly for the amounts agreed to in Appendix B.
- 2. SCOPE OF SERVICES. WMU shall provide the necessary facilities, services and personnel to carry out the described project. All activity shall be performed in a professional fashion to the highest academic standards.
- 3. TIME OF PERFORMANCE. This agreement shall commence on January 1, 2011, and shall continue 24 months through December 31, 2012.
- 4. SCHEDULE OF CHARGES. Second Party agrees to pay WMU in accordance with the budget and schedule in Appendix B. Included in the budget are non-allocable costs (24% of direct costs) at the rate established by the latest U.S. Department of Health and Human Services audit.
- 5. FEDERAL FUNDS. If this project is being supported with federal funds, please list the federal agency USDA CFDA #10.577 (if known) and the federal program title WIC Program.
- 6. LIABILITY. Each party to this agreement will be responsible for its own actions and must seek its own legal representative and bear its own costs, including judgments, in any litigation that may arise from its action during the performance of this agreement. It is specifically understood and agreed that neither party will indemnify the other party in such litigation.
- 7. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT FOR CAUSE. If either Second Party or WMU shall violate any of the covenants, understandings or stipulations of this agreement, and the violation is not cured within 15 days, the aggrieved party shall thereupon have the right to terminate this agreement by giving written notice to the other party of such termination and specifying the cause(s) and the effective date thereof. Such notice must be delivered 15 days before the effective date. In the event that such cause for termination shall lie with Second Party, all facets of the project must be taken to a logical stopping point, a fiscal and technical report prepared, and just and equitable compensation for any work performed on the project shall be tendered to WMU. Should the cause of termination lie with WMU, the amount of additional work to be carried out by WMU shall be subject to negotiation by all parties. Neither WMU nor Second Party shall be responsible for any liability for damages sustained by the other party by virtue of any breach of this agreement or through negligence on the part of the other party.
- 8. RECORDS. WMU shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records or other evidence pertaining to costs incurred for a period of three years from the date of final payment under this agreement. Such materials shall be readily available during the agreement and retention period for inspection, audit and/or duplication at all reasonable times by authorized representatives of Second Party.
- 9. DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS. Publications pertaining to this agreement or the services, data, or project to which it relates will not be made without prior approval of both parties. Neither party shall unreasonably withhold its approval.
 - WMU shall own and be responsible for all fees and costs of protecting all inventions, discoveries or other intellectual property arising from this work and Second Party agrees to execute assignment of any rights arising from this work to WMU.
- 10. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY. There shall be no discrimination against any employee who is employed in the work covered by this contract, or against any applicant for such employment, because of race, color, religion, age, sex, handicap or

- national origin. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- 11. MICHIGAN LAW. The law of the State of Michigan shall apply exclusively to every aspect of all disputes arising in connection with this agreement. By execution of this agreement, Second Party submits itself to the personal jurisdiction of the federal and state courts of Michigan.
- 12. CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS. Second Party certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief that it and its principals: Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency; Have not within a three-year period preceding this agreement been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (Federal, State, or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of federal or state antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property; Are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State, or local) with commission of any of the offences enumerated above in this certification; and Have not within a three-year period preceding this agreement had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, or local) terminated for cause or default.
- 13. AMENDMENTS. This agreement constitutes the complete understanding of the parties hereto and any amendments to the agreement must be agreed to in writing and signed by both parties.

3. Allowable Informal Scope of Work Changes

- A. The Contractor or the State may propose informal changes or revisions to the activities, tasks, deliverables and/or performance time frames specified in the Scope of Work, provided such changes do not alter the overall goals and basic purpose of the agreement.
- B. Informal SOW changes may include the substitution of specified activities or tasks; the alteration or substitution of contract deliverables and modifications to anticipated completion/target dates.
- C. Informal SOW changes processed hereunder, shall not require a formal agreement amendment, provided the Contractor's annual budget does not increase or decrease as a result of the informal SOW change.
- D. Unless otherwise stipulated in this agreement, all informal SOW changes and revisions are subject to prior written approval by the State.
- E. In implementing this provision, the State may provide a format for the Contractor's use to request informal SOW changes. If no format is provided by the State, the Contractor may devise its own format for this purpose.

4. Scope of Work

5. Invoicing

- A. For services satisfactorily rendered according to the scope of work and the terms, conditions and exhibits of this agreement, and upon receipt and approval of the invoices, Riverside County WIC Program agrees to compensate the Western Michigan University for actual expenditures incurred in accordance with the budget(s) attached hereto.
- B. Invoices shall include the agreement number and shall be submitted in triplicate in arrears not more frequently than every 30 days. Each invoice for the month shall be submitted for payment no more than sixty (60) calendar days following the close of each month, unless an alternate deadline is agreed to in writing by the program contract manager. - Be prepared on Contractor letterhead. If invoices are not on produced letterhead invoices
 must be signed by an authorized official, employee or agent certifying that the expenditures
 claimed represents actual expenses for the service performed under this contract.
- 2. Bear the Contractor's name as shown on the agreement.

- 3. Identify the billing and/or performance period covered by the invoice.
- 4. Itemize costs for the billing period in the same or greater level of detail as indicated in this agreement. Subject to the terms of this agreement, reimbursement may only be sought for those costs and/or cost categories expressly identified as allowable in this agreement and approved by CDPH.

6. Reimbursement

Costs under this agreement have been negotiated and reimbursement is limited to allowable costs incurred pursuant to the budget attachment(s). Said costs are inclusive of applicable charges including wages, salaries, fringe benefits, direct project demands and an indirect/overhead rate (if applicable) not to exceed the percentage rate indicated in the budget attachment(s).

7. Advance Payments

Riverside County WIC Program agrees to pay in advance, payment for the two (2) year subscription fees per this agreement.

8. Amounts Payable
