Code Enforcement uses this money for tire bins in conjunction with the community clean-ups, which have already been prescheduled. The in-kind requirement for the grant is already being expended by conducting the community clean-up program. Therefore, no additional general funds are being allocated for the in-kind requirement.

These funds allow our department to supplement the community clean-up events and use the monies to pay for bins that allow us to collect illegally dumped tires and tires collected by our citizen's in an effort to prevent future illegal dumping of these tires.

The Board's action today will allow for Code Enforcement to submit an updated resolution and continue to apply annually for the grants through calendar year 2015. Code Enforcement will return with any grant awards to the Board on an annual basis for approval to receive funding per Board Policy A-30.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE APPROVING THE APPLICATION OF GRANT FUNDS FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT WASTE TIRE CLEANUP AND AMNESTY EVENT GRANT

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code (PRC) Sections 42800 et seq. established the waste tire program for the State of California and assigns responsibility for its implementation to the Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery or CalRecycle; and

WHEREAS, CalRecycle is authorized to award grants under the Local Government
Waste Tire Cleanup and Amnesty Event program as identified in its current Waste Tire
Recycling Management Program; and

WHEREAS, procedures established by CalRecycle require a jurisdiction applicant to certify by resolution the approval of the jurisdiction's governing authority for submittal of a grant application before submission of said application to the CalRecycle; and

WHEREAS, if successful, the County of Riverside shall consider entering into a Grant Agreement with Cal Recycle for implementation of the activities authorized by the Grant Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors authorizes the submittal of an application to the Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery or CalRecycle for all available tire-related grants for the period of 2010 through 2015.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Riverside County Code

Enforcement Department, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute in the name of
the County of Riverside the grant application and any documents supporting said
application for the purpose of securing the grant funds.
