BACKGROUND:

The Department of Veterans' Services is currently leasing space in a non county-owned facility for \$3,600 a month. In 2009, the county purchased the First American Title Company buildings at the intersection of 14th Street and Orange Street in downtown Riverside for future growth and development of county facilities.

Recently, EDA conducted a building assessment to ascertain the condition of the facility for the purpose of relocating the Department of Veterans' Services into a permanent county-owned facility, saving the department \$44,000 a year. After completing the building assessment, it was discovered that several repairs must be made to the exterior and interior of the building, including a new roof, windows, ceiling tiles, lighting, electrical, data drops, and American Disabilities Act accommodations both inside and outside. In addition, testing has revealed that there are hazardous materials that must be abated and removed. The interior also needs to be reconfigured to provide adequate office space.

PROJECT BUDGET:

The approximate allocation of the project budget is as follows:

New Roof:	\$	160,000

Approval of this agenda item will authorize EDA to proceed with the necessary repairs to this building and ready it for the Department of Veterans' Services to occupy prior to their lease expiration.

Project related expenditures for Fiscal Year 2010/11 are estimated at \$350,000 and funded as follows: \$150,000 funded by Capital Improvement Program, \$100,000 funded by Community Development Block Grant, and \$100,000 funded by Deferred Maintenance. Projected expenses for Fiscal Year 2011/12 are \$165,000 by Deferred Maintenance.
