## **BACKGROUND:** (Continued)

Tubular steel fencing will surround the facility. The facility will include grass areas for seating, stadium seating, lighting, concession stand/fast food franchise, multiple picnic areas with permanent shade structures and all necessary, related improvements. Sidewalks, curbs and gutters will be installed on Trumble Road and Sherman Road to Vista Rd. It will provide the residents of Romoland an opportunity for recreational activities that are essential to the redevelopment of the Project Area. The Project will assist in the elimination of blighting conditions within the I-215 Corridor Project Area by constructing a state of the art recreational facility and creating a large number of full-time jobs and fostering the economic development of the surrounding community of Romoland and the Cities of Perris and Menifee.

The Board of Supervisors has made findings pursuant to Health and Safety Code 33445 consenting to the expenditure of redevelopment funds for this contract.

The Redevelopment Agency seeks to contract with GKK Works to prepare the bridging documents for the project. GKK was selected from a prequalified list of consultants that was approved by the Board of Supervisors.

CEQA analysis is underway and will be complete prior to bidding the construction of the project.

RDA staff recommends that the Board approve the use of the funds in order to move forward with the preparation of bridging documents.
