BACKGROUND (CONTINUED)

The Task Force proposes to meet monthly over the next year to develop recommendations for regional opportunities to capture and utilize stormwater more effectively as a local water supply source compatible with existing watershed plans. The Task Force will also evaluate flood control, water rights and water quality issues and problems associated with stormwater capture and use.

The Contribution will support SCWC staff administration of the Task Force effort. The Task Force projects will assist the District with developing its water conservation mission and also assist with meeting requirements contained in the NPDES MS4 Permits to evaluate opportunities to capture and re-use stormwater as a pollution prevention measure.
