SUBJECT: Initiation of LAFCO Application for Detachment of Property from the Banning Library District

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Adopt Resolution No. 2011-099 requesting that LAFCO commence proceedings for the detachment of the property described in the resolution from the Banning Library District;
- 2. Authorize the County Librarian to pay LAFCO filing fees related to the application in the amount of \$8,050; and
- 3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to file a Notice of Exemption.

BACKGROUND: The Banning Library District is an independent library district operating in the City of Banning. The Banning Library District operates the Banning Public Library and the Cabazon Branch Library. The communities of Cabazon, Whitewater, and Snow Creek are within the Banning Library District boundary, but are not currently receiving adequate library services from that district. Portions of the cities of Desert Hot Springs and Palm Springs also lie within the Banning Library District Boundary.

BACKGROUND

The Riverside County Library System currently provides library services to residents of the City of Desert Hot Springs through the Desert Hot Springs Library. Likewise, the City of Palm Springs currently provides library services to its residents through the Palm Springs Public Library.

The Riverside County Library System is willing and able to provide an improved level of library services to the communities of Cabazon, Whitewater, Snow Creek and the surrounding area, as proposed. Should LAFCO approve the application, it is estimated that cost savings shall more than mitigate revenue loss to the Banning Library District. A detailed plan of service, including financial analysis, shall be included in the LAFCO application.

It is therefore proposed that the property described in the resolution be detached from the Banning Library District.

In order for LAFCO to consider and process this proposal, it must be formally initiated by a resolution of application adopted by the County and the payment of filing fees.

Pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines Section 15061 (b)(3), a notice of exemption is appropriate as it can be seen with certainty there is no possibility that the proposed detachment will have a significant effect on the environment.

A RESOLUTION OF APPLICATION REQUESTING THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION COMMENCE PROCEEDINGS FOR THE DETACHMENT OF PROPERTY FROM THE BANNING LIBRARY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside desires to initiate proceedings pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Government Code section 56000 et seq.) for detachment of the property from the Banning Library District identified in Exhibit A, which exhibit is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference ("the Property"); and,

WHEREAS, the Property encompasses the communities of Cabazon, Whitewater and Snow Creek and portions of the cities of Desert Hot Springs and Palm Springs; and,

WHEREAS, the communities of Cabazon, Whitewater and Snow Creek are not currently receiving adequate library services from the Banning Library District; and,

WHEREAS, those portions of the Property within Desert Hot Springs are already receiving library services from the Riverside County Library System; and,

WHEREAS, those portions of the Property within Palm Springs are already receiving library services from the City of Palm Springs; and,

WHEREAS, the reason for the proposed detachment is to provide better library services and a more logical service boundary; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed detachment is currently inconsistent with the sphere of influence of the Banning Library District, but a conforming sphere of influence amendment will be concurrently submitted; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside assembled in regular session on April 26, 2011, that it hereby requests the Riverside County Local Agency Formation Commission commence proceedings for detachment of the Property from the Banning Library District.
