BACKGROUND (cont'd):

In Riverside County there are currently 670 licensed foster care homes, 768 relative and non-relative extended family members (NREFM) and 75 group home organizations serving over 3,916 children. These homes provide safe, stable and nurturing environments to children until they can be reunited with their biological parents or placed in a permanent home. With guidance from supportive adults, foster children do overcome the trauma of previous abuse and neglect. Without these permanent connections, former foster children are far more likely to endure homelessness, poverty, compromised health, unemployment, incarceration and other adversities after they leave the foster care system.

Foster care families are helping to build a brighter future for the children and youth they serve. By proclaiming May 2011 to be Foster Care Awareness Month in the County of Riverside, the Board of Supervisors continues a tradition of commitment and support for extraordinary efforts of foster care families serving the communities in our county.
