**SUBJECT:** Support of Senate Bill 848 (SB 848)

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

1) Adopt Resolution No. 2011-120, in support of Senate Bill 848.

2) Direct the Clerk of the Board to transmit copies of this resolution to members of the California Senate Committee on Judiciary and Senator Bill Emmerson.

## **BACKGROUND:**

SB 848 makes an important change in the organization of the Court of Appeals that will allow for greater efficiency in our court system.

Currently, the Court of Appeals is divided into six districts. The Fourth Appellate District consists of the counties of San Diego, Orange, Imperial, San Bernardino, Inyo and Riverside. SB 848 would create a Seventh Appellate District constituting the counties of San Bernardino, Inyo and Riverside.

Because the infrastructure (facilities, equipment and personnel) exists to support another appellate district, there will be no additional impact on the state's budget deficit. SB 848 would provide autonomy to the newly created district to manage its own budget priorities and internal operations. As Riverside and San Bernardino counties continue to grow, this reorganization would give the district greater control over local cases without being required to transfer those cases to other regions.

Resolution No. 2011-120 supports SB 848 for these aforementioned reasons.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
IN SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL 848

WHEREAS, currently, California's Court of Appeals is divided into six districts; and

**WHEREAS,** the Fourth Appellate District consists of the counties of San Diego, Orange, Imperial, San Bernardino, Inyo and Riverside; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 848 (SB 848), authored by Senator Bill Emmerson, would create a Seventh Appellate District constituting the counties of San Bernardino, Inyo and Riverside; and

WHEREAS, as Riverside and San Bernardino counties continue to grow, this reorganization would give the district greater control over local cases without being required to transfer those cases to other regions; and
