Octobratinental Concurrence	BACKGROUND: The Sheriff's Department implemented the RMS in February 1999. The RMS provides a participating agency the ability to enter cases and query case histories, to access the Master Name Index, Warrants, Master Location Index and Jail Locator databases. Local law enforcement, contract cities, and County, State and Federal agencies are using the System under contract with the Sheriff's Department. ## FY 2010-11 RMS Rate BR 11-080 Page 2

The proposed rate calculation was based on a review of recoverable FY 2009-10 expenditures and an estimate of FY 2010-11 expenditures to arrive at a FY 2010-11 RMS base cost of \$1,599,557. This composite estimate was then divided by the estimated FY 2010-11 transaction count of 51,631,944. The resulting quotient of 3.10 cents is charged City Police Departments and County, State and Federal agencies. Then, based on calendar year 2009 call data, 89.51% of the RMS cost or \$1,431,763 is distributed to the County unincorporated areas and the contract cities based on the number of calls originating from each area. The Department estimates \$1,061,890 in revenues to offset RMS expenses. Other County agencies contribute \$48,511 of this offsetting revenue.

The FY 2010-11 base RMS cost decreased \$67,365 or approximately 4% from the last fiscal year's actual cost. The salaries and benefits expense for staff dedicated to the RMS decreased by \$33,691. In addition, a County Information Technology Department credit for CORNET charges was the largest contributor to an overall \$33,674 decrease in RMS services and supplies expenditures.
