BACKGROUND (Continued):

County Fire - OES would like to submit an application for this grant to utilize grant funds for the architectural design, planning, space needs and infrastructure of the Counties. New EOC to be constructed at the Ben Clark Training Facility. The Board of Supervisors has directed that a new Emergency Operations Center (EOC) be one of the top Capital Improvement Projects for the county. Utilizing grants funds will allow the County to maximize our financial resources during these tough economic times.

This grant provides 75% funding for our initial phase of the EOC Design. The county would be responsible for providing the additional 25% for this phase. If awarded, this grant also requires the project to be completed within 36 months.

This is one of the only grants that provides funding for the design and construction of an emergency operations center.
