## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE,

#### STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE ASSESSOR TO USE THE COUNTY

#### WEBSITE TO PROVIDE VALUE NOTICES PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA REVENUE

#### AND TAXATION CODE 621

WHEREAS, the California legislature passed and the Governor signed legislation allowing assessors to post changes in the assessed value of real and personal property ("value notices") on county websites to inform each assessee of their property's change in value; and

WHEREAS, California Revenue and Taxation Code Section 621 requires that in order to provide value notices on a County website, assessors must first obtain the approval of the Board of Supervisors: and

WHEREAS, the electronic method of providing value notices is cost effective:

WHEREAS, for persons without internet access, the assessor will provide alternative means of providing value notices; and

WHEREAS, property owners will also receive value notice information as part of the regular property tax mailing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Riverside County Assessor is hereafter authorized to provide value notices to assessees of real and personal property by posting the value notice on the county website.

#### **RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Introduce Resolution 2011-124 to allow posting of annual assessment value for owners of real and personal property on the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder website pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code section 621.
- 2) Set the proposed Resolution for public hearing and adoption.

BACKGROUND: Assessor is required by California Revenue and Taxation Code section 619 to provide notice of changes in assessed value to owners of real and personal property whose property's full value has increased over its full value for the prior year when the assessment roll is turned over to the Auditor in July of each year. The information in the July value notice is repeated on the property tax bill that all property owners receive in early October.

Effective July 1, 2011, the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder, with the approval of the Board of Supervisors, can provide value notices on the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder website pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code section 621. The notice will be displayed through the existing Property Information Center

web access currently available to the public. Property owners will be able to search for the notice by their parcel number or situs address. The owner's name and mailing address will not display on the notice pursuant to state law.

Providing notice via the website will save the county staff time and postage costs. Assessees without internet access will be able to obtain a mailed value notice by contacting the assessor. A print display ad and public service announcements will be published for the first year notifying the public of the new procedure.
