**BACKGROUND:** The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that all substantial amendments to the Five-Year Consolidated Plan and the One-Year Action Plan be approved by the Board of Supervisors. All new activities added to the One-Year Action Plan as well as any significant increases in funding to an existing project will be considered substantial amendments.

Pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), all HPRP grantees must expend at least sixty percent (60%) of their HPRP funds within two years of the date of the grant agreement. In order to ensure the County's compliance with the two-year expenditure requirement, the Agency is seeking to reprogram funding from the Rapid Re-Housing component of HPRP to the Homelessness Prevention activities. Since the implementation of the County's HPRP, there has been significantly higher need and demand for Homelessness Prevention activities throughout the County compared to Rapid Re-Housing. Consequently, the reprogramming of additional funding to Homelessness Prevention will ensure timely expenditure of HPRP funding.

Pursuant to 24 CFR 91.105, and the HPRP regulations, the Economic Development Agency published a 30-day public notice notifying the public of the proposed amendment to the HPRP Substantial Amendment to the 2008-2009 One-Year Action Plan.
