Vacate Orders Relating to Statement of Abatement Costs [Case Nos. CV98-2891 & CV08-04622]

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BACKGROUND: On July 26, 2011, the Board of Supervisors entered the following orders, upon request of the Code Enforcement Department:

- (1) assess the reasonable costs of abatement of a public nuisance (unpermitted mobile home park and substandard mobile home/recreational vehicle) in the above-referenced matter to be **two thousand**, **four hundred thirty-one dollars and thirty cents (US \$2,431.30)**;
- (2) assess the costs of abatement against the above-described subject property;
- (3) authorize the recordation of a notice of abatement lien; and
- (4) authorize the abatement costs to be added to the tax roll as a special assessment
- (5) authorize and direct the Code Enforcement Department to take any reasonable actions to collect the amount owed.

After the Board of Supervisors made its orders, it was discovered that the late Supervisor Roy Wilson had advised the property owner that the costs would be waived.

Therefore, the Code Enforcement Department is seeking to vacate the orders made at the July 26, 2011 hearing.
