- c. The payment of funds for the project is consistent with the Implementation Plan adopted pursuant to Health and Safety Code 33490, which includes construction of public infrastructure; and
- 2. Consent to the payment of redevelopment funds for the project in the amount of \$578,332.

BACKGROUND:

Several years ago, the Redevelopment Agency put a strategy together to address blighting conditions in the Romoland Hwy 74 Eastbound area. Albert A. Webb Associates was hired to prepare plans and specifications for the project. Webb was also contracted separately to manage construction and inspections of each phase. In the last year, the first phase of the project was completed (Trumble Road and Interchange Landscaping). Phases II and III started in the fall of 2010. Due to a large number of rain delays and some design and engineering issues with the project, the completion date was pushed back by approximately six months. The contract amendment is to compensate Webb for these additional services.
