SUBJECT: National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System - Stormwater Discharge Permit Implementation Agreement - San Diego Region (Santa Margarita Drainage Area)

Background Continued: The Agreement between the District, County of Riverside, and the cities of Murrieta, Temecula and Wildomar, revises and supersedes the currently effective Implementation Agreement to:

- incorporate Board Order R9-2010-0016,
- · adds the new City of Wildomar.
- establishes the responsibilities of each party with respect to the NPDES Permit, and
- modifies cost sharing provisions to allow for increased funding of regional compliance programs and consulting services necessary to comply with the NPDES Permit.

During the NPDES/MS4 Joint Workshop on June 7, 2011, it was stated that these costs will triple due to the added mandates of Board Order R9-2010-0016.

In anticipation of these added costs this Board authorized the submittal of an unfunded mandates claim at the October 25, 2011, meeting. The Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District as the Principle Permittee is coordinating this effort with the County, and the cities of Temecula, Murrieta and the Wildomar. The mandates claim has been filed with the State Mandates Commission, a copy of the claim is attached.

This budget adjustment will provide the necessary additional funds to stay in compliance with San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board Order R9-2010-0016. See attached cost share, population estimates and map of the unincorporated portion of the upper Santa Margarita Watershed.

County Counsel has approved the Agreement as to legal form. A companion item appears on the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Board Agenda for approval this same date.
