Authorize the Economic Development Agency and/or the Sheriff's Department to incur any relevant and necessary costs up to \$150,000, required to submit a competitive application to the Correction Standards Authority including but not limited to any preliminary design costs, with reimbursement from the Tobacco Securitization funds.

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BACKGROUND:

On October 18, 2011 (Item 3.12), the Board approved Resolution No. 2011-257 which granted permission for the Economic Development Agency and Sheriff's Department to proceed with submitting an application to secure financing through the State's 2011 Local Jail Construction Financing Program (also known as AB 900, Phase II). Upon this approval, the project team submitted the required Interest Statement which notified the Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) that the County was seeking \$100 million in funding to further expand the capacity of our local jail system. On October 25, 2011, the project team received notification from the CSA that the county was approved to submit a formal application for funding which is due on or before January 4, 2012. As part of the application process, the Board must approve the attached Resolution No. 2011-280 which provides the required assurances and additional project information as noted in the application form.

The 2011 Local Jail Construction Financing Program is funded through the Public Safety and Offender Rehabilitation Services Act of 2007 (AB 900) which grants authority to the State Public Works Board (SPWB) and the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to enter into agreements with participating counties for local jail construction projects approved by the CSA. As the approving body, the CSA oversees the funding application process which includes issuing the Request for Proposals. The CSA released the application for Phase II funding on October 7, 2011. Per staff assessments, Phase II of the AB 900 funding cycle is best suited to the County's correctional needs and offers a significant opportunity to secure State funding for local jail construction projects.

Staff recommends that the Board adopt the attached Resolution and authorize the established project team to continue to take all necessary steps to submit a competitive application to the CSA.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-280 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE FOR ASSURANCES REQUIRED FOR 2011 LOCAL JAIL CONSTRUCTION FINANCING PROGRAM APPLICATION (AB900 – PHASE II)

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Agency and the Sheriff's Department have established a collaborative team to secure funding to further expand the capacity of the County's jail system through the construction of additional correctional system facilities;

WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have enacted the Public Safety and Offender Rehabilitation Act of 2007, which provides funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for acquisition, design, and construction of local jail facilities;

WHEREAS, the State Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) has been delegated the responsibility to administer the local jail construction funding program which includes the solicitation of applications for funding;

WHEREAS, the County with permission from the Board has submitted an Interest Statement to the CSA and has received notification that the County has been approved to submit a formal funding application; and

WHEREAS, the AB900 application procedures established by the CSA require a resolution from the Board of Supervisors which contain the following components;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on December 6, 2011, as follows:

- 1. That the Board of Supervisors hereby finds and declares that the above recitals are true, correct and incorporated herein.
- 2. That the following County staff will serve as key personnel for the project: Robert Field, Assistant County CEO/EDA, County Construction Administrator; Larry Parrish, Interim County Executive Officer, Project Financial Officer; and Jennifer McConville, Correctional Lieutenant, Project Contact Person.

- 3. That the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors has authorization to sign the Applicant's Agreement and submit the application for funding.
- 4. Assurance that the County will adhere to state requirements and terms of the agreements between the County, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, the Corrections Standards Authority and the State Public Works Board in the expenditure of any state financing allocation and county contribution funds.
- 5. Assurance that the County will appropriate after notification of conditional award of financing, but before state/county financing agreements, the amount of contribution identified by the County on the financing program application form submitted to the Corrections Standards Authority; the County acknowledges the need to identify the source of funds for county contribution and other county borne costs, and assures that the state and cash contribution does not supplant funds otherwise dedicated or appropriated for construction activities.
- 6. Assurance that the County will safely staff and operate the facility that is being constructed (consistent with Title 15, California Code of Regulations) within ninety (90) days after project completion.
- 7. Assurance that the County has project site control through either fee simple ownership of the site or comparable long-term possession of the site, and right of access to the project sufficient to assure undisturbed use and possession of the site, and will not dispose of, modify the use of, or change the terms of the real property title, or other interest in the site of facility subject to construction, or lease the facility for operation to other entities, without permission and instructions from the Corrections Standards Authority.
- 8. Attestation to \$3.1 million as the current fair market land value for the proposed expanded jail facility site.

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
