

**BACKGROUND:** The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) sponsored a program entitled Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP). The primary purpose of HPRP is to provide short-term housing assistance and supportive services to households facing the imminent loss of housing, or households that are currently homeless, as a result of the economic downturn. The Authority's Board of Commissioners approved the Authority to enter into an Agreement with the City through Board action on September 29, 2009. The agreement was effective September 30, 2009, and ends on September 30, 2012. The Authority began serving as subgrantee for the City's HUD HPRP allocation. The budget was \$1,383,070, divided between the City (\$293,999) and the Authority's (\$1,089,071). The City has amended the budget (attached Exhibit B-1) to increase the Authority portion by \$165,296.31 to a total of \$1,254,367.31 in order to extend the Authority's efforts to assist the high need within the City of Riverside for HPRP services. Without this additional funding, the Authority's HPRP allocation will be spent by the end of the calendar year.

# FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR THE USE OF HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION AND RAPID RE-HOUSING PROGRAM FUNDING

### HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR THE USE OF HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION AND RAPID RE-HOUSING PROGRAM FUNDING ("First Amendment") is entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2011, by and between the CITY OF RIVERSIDE, a California charter city and municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "City", and the HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, a public agency, hereinafter referred to as "Authority".

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, City and Authority entered into that certain Agreement For the Use of Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing ("HPRP")Program Funding on September 30, 2009; and

WHEREAS, City by Council action on April 5, 2011, approved a Supplemental Amendment to the 2008/2009 HUD Annual Action Plan to reallocate \$280,000 from the Rapid Re-Housing budget category to the Homelessness Prevention budget category under HPRP as detailed below; and

WHEREAS, City and Authority desire to amend and replace Exhibit "B" entitled "Budget" in its entirety in order to meet the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 legislative requirement to expend 100% of grant funds prior to the grant end date, for the purpose of providing emergency financial assistance and services to prevent eligible individuals and families from becoming homeless and to assist those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed, and to further provide administrative funds to the Authority for administrative activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree to the following:

Section 1. Exhibit "B-1" attached hereto this First Amendment replaces Exhibit "B" attached to the original Agreement.

Section 2. All terms and conditions of the Agreement not inconsistent with this First Amendment, shall remain in full force and effect and are incorporated herein by this reference as if set forth in full.
