On motion of Supervisor Stone, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, January 31, 2012, is adjourned in memory of Ernest Salgado, Sr., a 91-year-old Soboba Band of Luiseno Indians tribal member and U.S. Army World War II Veteran who was a “strong advocate and supporter of the American Indian Rights and education throughout his life.”

Born on October 16, 1920 on the Soboba Indian Reservation, Ernest attended the Valle Vista Elementary School in Hemet in the late 1920’s and the Sherman Indian High School in Riverside, where he played on the school’s championship baseball teams in the late 1930’s.

During World War II, Ernest served in five major combat campaigns, including the Battle of the Bulge and the Invasion of Normandy. He was awarded the Bronze Star and Silver Star Medals for bravery in addition to the European African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal.

As a tribal and community leader, Ernest served on the Soboba Tribal Council and was a charter member of Ahmium Education, Inc., serving as Vice-President of the Board of Directors since 1975. He was also a life member of the California Indian Education Association.

Ernest was a loving husband to his wife Fidelia of 60 years, who preceded him in death, and a devoted father, grandfather, great-grandfather, great-great grandfather, and friend who will always be remembered for his “Indian sense of humor” which had everyone “laughing to tears.” His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be deeply missed.
