SUBJECT: Mecca 18" Waterline Extension Project – Retention Reduction

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Directors approve a reduction of the contract retention for Jones Bros. Construction of Coachella, California from 10% to 5% per the general conditions of the contract.

BACKGROUND: On July 26, 2011 (Item 4.3), the Board of Directors approved the award of the construction contract to Jones Bros. Construction. Pursuant to the general conditions of the contract, the Redevelopment Agency (RDA) is currently retaining 10% of all progress payments to Jones Bros. Construction. The general conditions of the contract state that after the 50% completion point of the contract work if satisfactory progress is being made, RDA has the sole discretion to reduce the retention to a minimum of 5% of the contract.

BACKGROUND: (continued)

Jones Bros. Construction has completed 90% of the contract work and satisfactory progress has been made. Therefore, RDA recommends that the contract retention be reduced to 5%.

The retained funds to be released are an enforceable obligation to the Agency pursuant to the terms of the construction contract entered into with Jones Brothers Construction Company as the retention amount is an integral part of the contract compensation. The retention funds will come from the unpaid balance of the project budget and will not require additional funds from the agency and will not impact County General Funds.
