- 2. Directs the Executive Office to transfer up to \$548,107 from DIF from Regional Park Facilities Fund No. 30528, as needed, pursuant to billings received from the Regional Park and Open-Space District (District).

BACKGROUND: The Development Impact Fee (DIF) Program, which is governed under Ordinance 659.6, allows for the use of DIF funds for those facilities identified on the Public Facilities Needs list, in which the Hidden Valley Nature Center is included. SUBJECT: Allocation of Development Impact Fee Funds to the Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District for Park Water System Expansion at the Hidden Valley Nature Center – District II/II

BACKGROUND: The District is conducting a water system expansion due to an increase in service demand resulting from population growth, school group attendance and trail usage.

The Public Facilities Needs List (M.O. 3.5, 9/12/06) includes the Hidden Valley Nature Center as eligible under the DIF Regional Park Facilities Fund for funding up to \$548,107. The District is requesting use of these funds for the expansion to the on-site water system which includes such new features as a storage tank, well and distribution system. The DIF funds will be released to the District pursuant to billings. Contracts will be subject to Board approval.
