BACKGROUND: This project will provide paving of approximately 1.55 miles of access road, bike lane and multipurpose trail within the Hidden Valley Wildlife Reserve northerly of Arlington Avenue.

The proposed road improvements will consist of paving existing dirt access road with two lanes of hot mix asphalt and fifteen to twenty feet wide paved bike lane, constructing concrete dip section and overside drains, drainage improvements, installing painted traffic stripes and thermoplastic pavement markings, pavement markers, roadway signs and any other associated work as may be required.

On October 5, 2010, item 13.1, the Board of Supervisors approved the agreement between the Riverside County Regional Park and Open-Space District and Riverside County Transportation Department, for the design, bidding, administration, and construction of improvements by the Transportation Department. The Parks District will provide 100% of the project funding and will be responsible for the maintenance of the facility.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel.
