Born on May 5, 1929 in Los Angeles, California, Hubert graduated with honors in Civil Engineering from USC and served our Country in the U.S. Army for two years. In 1955, he joined Albert A. Webb Associates and became President in 1984 and Chairman of the Board in 2000. An expert in water resources engineering, his clients included the Western Municipal Water District, Jurupa Community Services District, Crestline Lake Arrowhead Water Agency, City of Norco, and Edgemont Community Services District. In addition to securing a water supply contract with the State of California Department of Water Resources which led to the formation of the Crestline Lake Arrowhead Water Agency, he designed 36,500 feet of pipeline and three pump stations to deliver water from the Riverside and Gage Canals to Western Municipal Water District's agricultural system. He also served as Chief Technical Advisor for the Riverside/Corona Feeder Project and developed the Box Springs Tank Complex.

As a registered civil engineer, Hubert was active in the American Society of Civil Engineers, California Society of Professional Engineers, American Water Works Association, National Ground Water Association, California Water Environment Federation, Federal Water Environment Federation, and National Society of Professional Engineers. In 2008, Hubert was recognized by the Water Resources Institute (WRI) of California State University, San Bernardino as the Water Hero Award recipient for his donation of valuable, historical water resource documents from the firm's library to the WRI archives.

On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Benoit, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, June 5, 2012, be adjourned in memory of Naomi Schwartz, a 78-year-old three-term First District Supervisor of Santa Barbara County, from 1993 to 2004, who will always be remembered as "great public servant, leader, and friend."

A New York City native and former elementary school teacher, Naomi moved to Santa Barbara in 1967, where she began her political career collecting campaign signatures to create the California Coastal Commission in response to the 1969 oil spill and later served on the commission. From 1982 to 1992, she worked as chief of staff for State Senator Gary Hart and was also a founding member of Coastwatch, the Fund for Santa Barbara, and the Santa Barbara Women's Political Committee.

As an instrumental force in "Democratic, environmental, and women's movements," Naomi was well-respected by her colleagues and the community. Recently, she led efforts to restore the Historic County Courthouse and served on the Dean's Council of the Bren School of Environmental Management at UCSB.

Naomi was a loving mother and grandmother whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be dearly missed.

The Board of Supervisors commemorates her service to the County of Santa Barbara.

IT WAS FURTHER ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors expresses its heartfelt condolences to the family of Naomi Schwartz.
