

BACKGROUND: On May 14, 1991, the Board adopted Resolution 91-265 to collect a one dollar fee added to all vehicle registrations in the County, pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 9250.14. Per this Code Section, the fee must be earmarked for programs designed to enhance the deterrence, investigation and prosecution of vehicle theft crimes. Based on the recommendation of the Riverside County Law Enforcement Administrators Association these funds were directed in equal amounts to the Sheriff's Department and the District Attorney. The Sheriff's Department created Trust Fund 5097 (current Fund # 11013 308147) to account for its share.

In September 1993, the Sheriff's Department received Board approval to use the trust funds to create RAID, a multi-jurisdictional task force that interfaced with the California Highway Patrol (CHP), Department of Motor Vehicles, Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation and all law enforcement agencies in Riverside County for the sharing of information related to vehicle theft.

A RAID Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) remained in effect from September 1, 1993 through December 31, 2002. Subsequent to this date, per the recommendations of the RAID Executive Committee, it has been amended as necessary.

The RAID MOU, as amended, specifies that the Sheriff, or his designee, shall serve as Director and Chair of the task force Executive Committee.

The MOU specifies that the task force Coordinator be staffed by a CHP Lieutenant. The CHP also provides three full time theft Investigators to the task force. This commitment is covered by a State contract that the Board approved on 4/10/12 (3.41). The RAID fund only reimburses the overtime of the CHP theft investigators.

The RAID fund currently reimburses the Sheriff's Department for a Sergeant, an Investigator (70% reimbursement) and an Office Assistant II (75% reimbursement). The Department is also reimbursed for its management time administering the fund.

The MOU also states that the Sheriff's Department may establish by department appropriation, funding for special and extraordinary expenses incurred during the investigation of vehicle thefts.

The Sheriff's Department is recommending that the Board ratify the Amendment to the RAID task force MOU extending its original expiration date of January 1, 2012 until January 1, 2014. This Amendment has been signed by representatives of the Sheriff's Department, California Highway Patrol (Inland and Border Divisions), Riverside, Murrieta and Indio Police departments, the State Department of Insurance and the County District Attorney, Paul Zellerbach.

In addition, this Amendment specifies a reimbursement of 70% of the salaries and benefits for straight time and 200 hours of annual overtime for the sworn personnel assigned to the task force. Currently, the cities of Indio, Murrieta and

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Riverside assign officers full time to the task force. All three cities will be reimbursed in excess of \$100,000 for contributing one officer each to the task force.

To facilitate the maximum utilization of the County's task force partners and the prompt full reimbursement for the partners' services, the Sheriff's Department and County Purchasing are recommending that the Board exempt the Purchasing Agent from reporting special law enforcement team members as sole source task force partners to the Board when identified by the RAID Executive Committee, and authorize the Purchasing Agent to contract with these partners in amounts approved by the Committee. Further, the Department recommends that this exemption extend to all Sheriff's special law enforcement team committees, wherein the Sheriff is the Director and/or Chair.

5	Revise Section XIII, REIMBURSEMENT TERMS FOR PARTICIPATING AGENCIES:

7 8	This amendment shall reflect the agreement discussed at the December 14 th , 2011, RAID Executive Board Meeting and will remain in effect until the termination of Task Force Funding as set forth in		
9	Vehicle Code Section 9250.14 (AB 286), unless a later enacted statute, which is enacted prior to		
10 11	January 1, 2018 deletes or extends that date. Participating agencies (Except CHP and DOI) will be reimbursed for 70 percent of full salary and benefits and 200 hours of overtime annually for sworn		
12	personnel assigned to the task force. The aforementioned amendment to the current		
13 14	Memorandum of Understanding will be extended from its original expiration date of January 2012, until January of 2014, or until such time that RAID has established sufficient reserve based		
15	on increased revenues and continued sound fiscal management. At which time, the Executive		
16 17	Board will be asked to repeal this amendment to our MOU.
