BACKGROUND: On November 2, 2004, the California electorate passed Proposition 69, which became law on November 3, 2004. The intent was to clarify existing law and to enable the state's DNA and Forensic Identification Database and Data Bank Program to become a more effective law enforcement tool.

Section 76104.6 of the California Government Code establishes a county DNA Identification Fund for reimbursement of expenditures and administrative costs incurred by the local sheriff or other law enforcement agencies in compliance with PC Section 298.

In general, Proposition 69, as made law in Penal Code Sections 296 (a) and 298, requires law enforcement or custodial agencies, statewide, to collect buccal swab samples, right thumbprints, and a full palm print impression of each hand, and any blood specimens or other biological samples collected from felony arrestees be forwarded promptly to the Department of Justice for law enforcement identification analysis and entry into the Department of Justice DNA Database.

The Sheriff's Department requests that the Board approve a County Executive Office transfer from the County's DNA Identification Fund, in the amount of \$1,140,584, to reimburse the Corrections budget for the cost to collect the biological samples from felony booking detainees entering the County detention facilities during FY 2011-12. The Sheriff's Department also requests reimbursement in the amount of \$59,076 for the Coroner's cost to collect DNA samples for the period encompassing May of 2011 through April 2012. The total fund transfer amounts to \$1,199,660. Since the Department has already programmed \$1,112,596 in inter-fund reimbursements for the Sheriff's Corrections budget, it requests the remaining amount of \$87,064 as a budget adjustment.
