PROBATION, PAROLE AND COMMUNITY SUPERVISION WEEK
July 15 – 21, 2012

Whereas the American Probation and Parole Association, has declared July 15 through July 21, 2012, as National American Probation, Parole, and Community Supervision Week; and,
