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BACKGROUND: (Continued)

Pursuant to the general conditions of the contract, the Economic Development Agency (EDA) is currently retaining 10% of all progress payments to PWCI. The general conditions of the contract state that after the 50% completion point of the contract work, if satisfactory progress is being made, the county has sole discretion to reduce the retention to a minimum of 5% of the contract. The project is now 90% complete and work is satisfactory. This Board action will release \$303,973 in retained funds to the contractor.

Sufficient funds for this project are budgeted for FY 2012/13. All costs associated with this project will be funded by the Palm Desert Redevelopment Pass-Thru Funds and Desert Healthcare District Funds, thus no net county costs will be incurred.
